

Rita Announces Her Separation From D. Haymes

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 30. — Actress Rita Hayworth said Monday she is separating from Crooner Dick Haymes.

She did not immediately indicate whether she would file suit for a divorce.

But the flame-haired star conferred for more than an hour with attorney Maury L. Spanier, representing Bartley Crum, who has handled most of the litigation in-

volved in her previous divorce suits.

In a statement issued jointly by Miss Hayworth and the attorney, the actress said:

"I have separated from Dick because I believe that in the best interests of my children, Dick and myself, it is necessary that both of us have time to think things out."

"I don't know at this time whether the separation will be final," Haymes said, when informed of the statement. "I don't believe it."

A spokesman for the actress said he thinks the rift is serious. He said he doubted there would be a reconciliation.

Rita, appearing thin and tired, was tight-lipped and declined to answer questions.

Earlier, Haymes denied he and

Rita were separated but said they had an "argument" last Wednesday.
