Bank Debits Increase In Douglas, Coos, Curry

Bank debits in the Douglas, Coos and Curry Counties area showed a rise of 28.2 per cent for July of 1955 over July a year ago.

This was the report from the University of Oregon Bureau of Business Research, which compiled the figures. The debits represent the dollar value of checks drawn against the deposit accounts of individuals and business firms.

The bureau reports that at the same time, a rise of 2 per cent was noted for July over June.
