2 Inmates Overpower Attendant And Escape

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—Two inmates of the Eastern State Hospital at Medical Lake, one of them a ringleader in the July riot at the state penitentiary at Walla Walla, overpowered an attendant Sunday night and escaped.

The men were identified as Herman Shaler, 35, and James Eiland, 35, both described as very dangerous.
