

## Elementary, Junior High School Assignments Listed By Superintendent Deller

The following assignment of students in elementary and junior high schools in District 4 has been announced by Supt. M. C. Deller. In approving the distribution, school board members noted that considerable shifting within a short time was anticipated as summer population shifts are not yet known.

**BENSON**  
First through sixth graders living north of Deer Creek and east of Stephens Street, south of the intersection of Winchester and Stephens, to and including Howe Street, will attend Benson. Also in the area are pupils in grades four through six living east of Fowler Street south of Deer Creek to Douglas. This includes the area east from the top of the hill on East Douglas to the eastern limits of the district.

**RIVERSIDE**  
The area is bounded on the north by highway scales on old Highway 99, south to the junction of Winchester Street and Stephens Street, including the Bellvue and Prospect Street areas. Western boundary is new Highway 99. Included in the area are the residential districts of Newton Creek, Cloverdale, Vine Street and Sweetbriar. The one exception concerns fifth and sixth graders living south of the state scales and Housley Street. They will attend Wilbur School.

**WINCHESTER**  
Students in grades one through four living north of the scales on old Highway 99 and south of the river, including pupils living on Del Rio Road, will attend Winchester. Fourth graders living north of the railroad track. Additionally, first, second and third graders on East Douglas Street south to Deer Creek and east of Howe Street, including Rifle Range Road, will be transported to Rose.

**WILBUR**  
Pupils in grades one, two, three, five and six, living north of the North Umpqua River, with the exception of students in grades one through four living on Del Rio Road, will attend Wilbur. The fourth graders will be transported to Winchester. In addition, pupils in grades five and six living south of the North Umpqua River and south to and including Housley Street will attend Wilbur.

**CENTRAL JHS**  
Seventh and eighth graders living in the Rose, Fullerton and Benson elementary school areas, as outlined, will attend this junior high. Additionally, pupils from the Melrose area who attended Central as seventh graders will remain at Central.

**Bus Driver Keeps Going With Injured Passengers**  
LODI, Calif. (AP)—Despite pleas from 10 injured passengers, a damaged Greyhound bus—its driver also injured—traveled 22 miles along a highway before police stopped it at a roadblock Monday night.

A report Tuesday by California Highway Patrol officers said the bus, driven by James O. Seymour, 40, of Sacramento, collided with a truck-trailer rig after 11 p.m. on Highway 99, about 9 miles south of Sacramento. The bus was en route from Seattle to Los Angeles.

The report said the bus driver kept going, but later explained he knew some passengers were injured and was seeking aid for them.

At Lodi the 11 injured were taken to a hospital.

Six passengers and the bus driver remained at the hospital Tuesday for further examination. All were from California.
