

Two White Men Are Charged With Murder Of Negro Boy

GREENWOOD, Miss. (AP) — A fisherman found the body of a 14-year-old Negro boy in the Tallahatchie River Wednesday and the sheriff said two white men will be charged with murder.

The boy, Emmitt Louis Till of Chicago, had been visiting an uncle at the nearby community of Money before his disappearance early Sunday.

Officers said the teen-ager apparently had been killed by a blow on the head and his body weighted with a cotton gin pulley fastened with barbed wire.

Sheriff George Smith said Roy Bryant, a storekeeper of Money, and his half-brother, J. W. Milam, would be charged with murder. Both are being held now on kidnapping charges.

The sheriff said he was told two white men and a woman took the boy from his uncle's home early Sunday after the boy allegedly made "ugly remarks" to Bryant's wife. The search for the woman is continuing.

The spot where the body was found was about 15 miles north of Money.

The sheriff said Bryant admitted taking the boy from the house of his uncle, Mose Wright. However, Bryant said the youth was released when Mrs. Bryant said he was not the boy who made "ugly remarks" to her at the Bryant store in Money last Wednesday.

In Chicago, Till's mother, Mamie Bradley, wept at the news. "I can't think, I just can't think. I'm frozen. He didn't do anything to deserve that. Somebody is going to pay for this. The entire state of Mississippi is going to pay for this."

In New York City, a spokesman for the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, said the case appeared to "qualify as a lynching."

He said the last previous established case of lynching in the United States occurred in 1932.

Body Of Man Sought For Two Slayings Found

BUFFALO, W. Va. (AP) — Searchers Wednesday found the body of 47-year-old Lincoln Sayre, sought since Monday night for the slaying here of his two sisters-in-law.

State Trooper H. C. Baverly said Sayre had killed himself. Possemen earlier had found a note in which he said he planned to "go out of this world."

Police said they also had located Sayre's estranged wife at Milton, W. Va.

Navy Veteran Tells Of Being Fired Because His Parents Belonged To Red Groups

WASHINGTON (AP) — A 26-year-old Navy veteran told senators Wednesday he was fired from a Navy civilian job as a security risk on grounds his mother and father were in a subversive organization, but was never told the name of the organization.

Joseph H. Summers Jr., of Providence, R. I., said it was suggested to him "it might be a little different if I didn't live with them."

His mother, Mrs. Pauline Summers, who sat with him at the witness table, testified she never had belonged to any organization she knew to be considered Communist or subversive by the government.

She said that she did belong to the left-wing Progressive Party, whose 1948 presidential nominee was Henry A. Wallace; to the International Women's League for Peace and Freedom, and the World Affairs Council. None of these is on the attorney general's subversive list.

Summers, who was on active duty with the Navy from 1951 to 1953, got a probationary job as a metalmith's helper at the Quonset Point, R. I., Naval Air Station last January. He said he helped overhaul and repair fighter planes. He was dismissed July 29.

"They told me it had nothing to do with me," he testified. "My record was clean. It was my parents."

The Navy could fire him without filing formal charges or giving him a hearing since he did not have permanent Civil Service status.

Ormar Wheat Variety Approved For Release

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — Ormar, a new wheat variety based on a cross of Elmar and Elgin, has been approved for release to Northwest growers, the Washington State College experiment station said Wednesday.

Ormar is a red-chaffed soft white winter wheat slated to replace Elmar, the leading soft wheat produced in the more humid areas of the Pacific Northwest.

Dr. Mark Buchanan, director of the WSC station, said the decision to release Ormar was made Tuesday at a meeting of experiment station directors, agronomists, millers and bakers of Washington, Idaho and Oregon.

B-47 Statojets Outbomb B36s For Fairchild Trophy

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP) — Swept-wing B47 Statojets out-bombed the B36s to capture the Muir Fairchild Trophy Wednesday for the first time in the seven years of competition in the Strategic Air Command "World series" of bombing and navigation.

It was the 320th Bomb Wing of March AFB here, a B47 outfit, which emerged as the overall winner, bombing and navigation combined, with 1,630 points in the final official tabulations announced Wednesday.

Two B36 outfits, the 92nd from Fairchild AFB, Spokane, Wash., and the 6th from Walker AFB, N.M., placed second and third with 1,618 and 1,607 points, respectively, but the next four wings in the standings are B47 wings.

The B47 crew, commanded by Maj. Horace C. Traylor of Winnboro, S.C., from the 33rd Bomb Wing, Castle AFB, Merced, Calif., took first place in the overall crew standings, bombing and navigation combined.

There were 24 B47 and 10 B36 wings in competition, each with two crews entered.
