

Many Patients Dischargeable, Claims Doctor

MEDICAL LAKE, Wash. (AP)—The acting superintendent of Eastern State Hospital said at a public hearing recently that "one-third of the patients here could be cared for in their own homes or nursing homes if their family and community would have them."

Dr. M. M. Campbell made the statement before members of the interim legislative council committee on state institutions at a public hearing designed to give council members a look at the hospital problems and a chance to inspect the institution.

Campbell added that these patients have harmless cases of mental unsoundness. A recent survey of 360 of the hospital's 2,256 patients, all over age 65, showed that 18 were considered dischargeable. Dr. Campbell said, Steps have been taken to arrange for their discharge, he added.

In answer to a question from Sen. Neil J. Hoff of Tacoma, committee chairman, Campbell said the hospital's primary problem is a lack of autonomy, and lack of coordination between state departments in Olympia.

"In other words, Dr. Campbell, your problem in administering the hospital is that you have all the responsibility and none of the authority," Rep. Patrick Sutherland of Seattle suggested.

Dr. Thomas A. Harris, director of state institutions, agreed that he felt the law should be changed to give hospital supervisors the freedom to fulfill their responsibilities.

Morse Joins Neuberger In Freight Car Fight

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) has joined Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) in asking the Interstate Commerce Commission to investigate Oregon's freight car shortage. In a letter to the ICC, Morse said he had received information indicating the shortage was most severe in areas where the Southern Pacific Railroad provides the only rail transportation.

He also said that SP had been accused of favoring California shippers.

"If the Southern Pacific is in fact discriminating against Oregon in the distribution of freight cars," he wrote, "it is a practice that cannot be endured much longer. The Oregon lumber industry is in the category of small business."

The senator said the ICC should investigate the entire freight car shortage situation, including the repair program and that there should be a re-appraisal of the entire freight transportation system.

Germans Find Drink Too Strong For Khrushchev

MOSCOW (AP)—The Germans have finally found a drink that's too strong for Russia's convivial Nikita Khrushchev. It's cherry brandy produced in Germany's Black Forest region.

At Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's lavish luncheon for Soviet leaders Sunday, the Soviet Communist Party secretary took a gulp of the stuff, known as Kirschwasser.

A member of the German delegation said Khrushchev choked and spluttered. "This stuff is for oxen. I never in my life drank anything that burned my throat so much."

Origin Of Fish Caught On Seas Object Of Study

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP)—Developing a research program to determine the origin of fish caught on the high seas was the goal of the American section of the three-nation International North Pacific Fisheries Commission which opened a meeting here recently.

Milton C. Brooding, of San Francisco, chairman of the American section, said the research program now under way includes studies of fish body structure to determine basic characteristics of native Asiatic waters fish and those fish native to waters adjacent to North America.

The program will be presented at the full committee gathering in Tokyo next month.

Brooding told the opening session that the commission is "very concerned about the great amount of fish being caught in mid-ocean."

He pointed out that under an international treaty, the Japanese fishing fleet has been required to operate west of 170 West longitude. The Japanese salmon fleet reported a huge catch this year.

United States members here for the preliminary meeting, other than Brooding, are Edward W. Allen, Seattle, commission vice-chairman; John Farley, Washington, D.C., director of the Fish and Wildlife Service; and John Clausen, Anchorage, Alaska.

Biological advisers are Dr. W. F. Thompson, director of the Fisheries Institute at the University of Washington, and Bert Walford, chief biologist with the Fish and Wildlife Service.
