Experts Say Ike Will Run If His Health Permits

DENVER — Republican strategists said today President Eisenhower's own evaluation of his health next spring may determine largely whether he will run again next year.

The President's precedent-setting conference here over the weekend with the Republican leaders of 48 states, the District of Columbia and Hawaii left technically unanswered the \$64,000 question of whether he will run again next year.

But many of those who attended reached this conclusion:

If the President feels next spring that he can take on four more years in the White House without danger of physical incapacitation, he will be a candidate.

Republicans who talked with Eisenhower spoke of his outward physical fitness and reported his "bubbling enthusiasm" about Republican party prospects next year. They said they think the odds are heavy that he will run again.

Appraisers Will Put Price Tags On Federal Homes

WASHINGTON — Appraisers will start soon putting a price tag on homes owned by the government in the atomic cities of Oak Ridge, Tenn., and Richland, Wash.

The Federal Housing Administration announced here said FHA teams of real estate appraisers will set up offices in each area within two weeks.

Congress has authorized sale of the homes by the Atomic Energy Commission to individuals with priorities assigned present occupants.

The setting of a fair market value on the homes is a first step toward disposing of the property. Oak Ridge, with 32,500 inhabitants, and Richland, with 28,000, were built originally by Army Engineers as part of the huge Manhattan Project.

The announcements said two nationally recognized appraisers and consultants—Richard Hall of Washington, D. C., and Watson A. Bowes of Denver—have been named to assist the FHA.

Hall will be technical advisor at Oak Ridge, and Bowes at Richland.

The appraisal job will include setting values on home sites and on commercial and other properties as well as residences.

The device is designed so the engine cannot be started in any gear except neutral. Another built-in safety factor prevents the transmission from accidentally being shifted into reverse at speeds above 10 miles an hour.

Offered as optional equipment are safety seat belts and a newly designed vacuum-operated brake system with automatic transmission installations.

Quarles Say Air Force To Continue Training

WASHINGTON — Secretary Donald A. Quarles says the Air Force plans neither to stiffen nor to ease its course of training men to survive as prisoners of war.

Disclosure of simulated brainwashing and other tactics used at the school at Stead Air Force Base, Nev., last week brought some criticism that it was too rough. Quarles told a CBS audience however, the program "is definitely justified."

Appeals Court Is Requested To Overrule NLRB Decision

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Court of Appeals here has been asked to overrule a National Labor Relations Board decision that a union, in its capacity as an employer, is not subject to the Taft-Hartley Law ban on unfair labor practices.

The AFL Office Employees Union, and its local 11 at Portland, Ore., has petitioned the court to set aside the 3-2 opinion by the NLRB Aug. 28 that unions in such cases are covered by its policy against taking cases involving non-profit organizations.

The case that brought the ruling involved an AFL Teamsters Union subdivision in Portland, charged with unfair labor practices toward its own employees.

An NLRB examiner had found the Teamsters organization guilty of trying to prevent teamster employers from joining the AFL Office Employees Union.

College Education Value Estimated By Bureau

WASHINGTON — How much is a college education worth in cold cash?

On the average, \$91,000, two Census Bureau officials reported to the annual meeting of the American Sociological Society.

Paul C. Glick and Herman P. Miller said:

"Over a lifetime, the average college graduate can expect to receive about \$100,000 more income than the average high school graduate. Since the direct and indirect costs of the college education are roughly estimated at \$9,000, it is concluded that a college education represents a sound investment from a purely monetary viewpoint."

The census men cautioned, however, that a college degree is no guarantee of higher earnings. They said about one fourth of all college graduates earn less than high school graduates in the same age group.

Collins Critical Of Republic Fund As Subversive

WASHINGTON — A charge that the Fund for the Republic threatens national security has been met with a reply that the fund "is dedicated to the principles of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution."

The charge was made Sunday by Seaborn P. Collins, national commander of the American Legion, who called on three million Legionnaires to "have no truck" with activities sponsored by the fund. Collins said "it appears that the Fund for the Republic... is threatening and may succeed in crippling the national security."

In New York, Dr. Robert M. Hutchins, head of the fund and one-time president of the University of Chicago, retorted:

"It is too bad that Mr. Collins had not bothered to try to find out the purposes and activities of the fund before he attacked it."

"The fund is dedicated to the principles of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution."

Collins said the fund has carried on "constant, loaded criticism of congressional and administration efforts to resist Communist infiltration." He said this "propaganda is considered by the American Legion to be as dangerous as it is untrue."

Television Receiver Prices Said Rising

NEW YORK — Prices of television receivers are rising. A \$20 hike in prices on most models is being made by Allen B. DuMont Laboratories Inc. Motorola has raised prices on 13 models \$10 to \$30 a set.

Emerson Radio and Admiral Corp. announced last month they were upping prices \$10 to \$20 a set. Other manufacturers cite rising costs of labor and materials and indicate they will join in mark ups.

Mother Hopes Son Will Get Home For Birthday

SEATTLE — The mother of Walter A. Rickett, one of 10 Americans F-4 China announced would be released from prison shortly, expressed hope he would get home in time for his 34th birthday Oct. 28.

But Mrs. A.J. Rickett wasn't raising her hopes too high.

"It's been a long, long wait, and we've been disappointed so many times," she said. "I won't get my hopes up until I know he's out of China."

The Ricketts received a letter from their son the first week of August but it contained no hint he knew of his approaching release.
