Hotel Chain Planning Portland Luxury Building

PORTLAND (AP) — The Sheraton hotel chain hopes to build a 300-room luxury hotel in a proposed shopping center on Portland's east side, an official of the firm reported here.

Ernest Henderson, president of the Sheraton Corp. of America, said Sheraton is negotiating with the Lloyd Corp. for property in the proposed Lloyd Center. He said plans call for a 300-room luxury hotel with an additional 200 rooms to be added should the need appear.

This is the second new large hotel proposed for Portland. Ward H. Cook, realtor who has been working in the promotion for a downtown hotel, said the Sheraton announcement was not expected to have any effect on his plans.

Umatilla Auto Accidents Fatal To Three Persons

PENDLETON (AP) — Three persons were killed in separate automobile accidents in Umatilla County over the weekend, increasing the traffic toll in the county to 18 for the year.

An automobile left Highway 730, eight miles east of Umatilla, early Monday, and killed Paul Kenneth Brand, 25, Pasco, Wash., in crashing into a roadside ditch. State police said Brand apparently fell asleep at the wheel. He was alone.

Another car also crashed off a road Saturday night, killing Edward Elmer McKinney of Ukiah. The crash was on Highway 395, north of Ukiah Junction.

Two passengers, Dennis Winword of Ukiah and Louise A. Stewart of Spokane, were taken to St. Anthony's Hospital in Pendleton for treatment of injuries.

Arnold Crowlson, 19, Elgin, died in a La Grande hospital Sunday from injuries suffered when the motorcycle on which he was riding hit a cow crossing Highway 30 at Emigrant Springs, some 28 miles east of here.

Jack L. Wilson, 19, Longview, driver of the cycle, was hurt seriously and remained in the hospital at La Grande Monday. The cow was killed.

Solar Battery Will Be Used To Operate Phones

NEW YORK (AP) — Bell Telephone Laboratories announced Tuesday that its new solar battery, which draws energy from the sun, will be used to power a rural telephone system near Americus, Ga., for the first time on Oct. 4.

The experiment will be conducted by Southern Bell Telephone Co., an operating unit of American Telephone & Telegraph Co., of which Bell Labs is the research arm.

The solar battery, unveiled last spring by Bell Labs, will generate enough power to operate eight phones. Mounted atop a telephone pole, it will generate up to 10 watts of electricity every moment that the sun shines. Since the circuit, of which the eight phones are a part, requires only one watt, the surplus will go into storage batteries mounted on the pole for use after sunset.

Opinion Asked On Whether Free Speech Abridged

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Hennings (D-Mo) announced Tuesday the Senate subcommittee on constitutional rights is soliciting opinion on whether free speech and press rights are being abridged.

Hennings said he believed the questionnaire his group is distributing would help the subcommittee in its current study of civil rights questions.

But he said he also hoped it would provoke public discussion of "the most controversial issues."

Suit Of Indians Will Be Delayed

PORTLAND (AP) — The suit of Klamath and Umatilla Indians to prevent enforcement of state hunting laws on their reservations was put over by Federal Judge William G. Clark until Nov. 21 when it came before him Monday. By that time, attorneys are expected to present facts on which they are agreed, to save trial time.

The suit stems from congressional action which put the reservation Indians under state laws—except where treaty rights are involved. And their status as hunters and trappers is in dispute.

The treaties with the two tribes says they may hunt in common with the whites. The state says that means they must conform to season and bag limits and buy licenses. The tribes say it does not. The federal government has entered the case, Dist. Atty. Ed Luckey said, to say that a constitutional question is involved.

Clark Walsh of the State Game Commission said there had been no attempt to enforce the state game laws on the reservations while the tribes readied their suits.
