1956 Mercuries' Price To Range Up \$57 to 137

DETROIT — Suggested list prices for the 1956 Mercury passenger cars will range generally from \$37 to \$137 higher than the 1955 models. The cars go on dealer display Thursday. The suggested prices, announced Wednesday, range from \$2,612 for the custom modelist two-door sedan, to \$2,684 for the four-door, eight passenger station wagon in the Monterey series. In the case of the modelist, the price is \$3 lower than that of the lowest priced model in the 1955 line. The prices do not include distribution and delivery charges, suggested preparation and conditioning charges, federal excise, state or local taxes, or optional equipment and accessories. The \$57 increase is suggested on the Montclair four-door sport sedan and the \$137 advance on the Montclair convertible. A reduction of \$25 on power steering and \$80 on air conditioning is made throughout the line. These are optional features as is a safety package, including padded instrument panel, padded sun visors and safety seat belts. The package, including belts for driver and front seat passenger, is listed at \$28.

New Land Speed Record Set By Rocket Sled

LOS ANGELES — A new land speed record of better than 21 miles a minute has been set by an unmanned rocket sled at the naval ordnance test station at China Lake, Calif. W. D. Drinkwater, Navy scientist, said the steel-shod runners of the sled turned red-hot as it hit 1,280 miles an hour over a 4.1 mile course. Ten rocket motors hurled the heavy sled to peak velocity in two seconds. The highest speed previously announced for an unmanned sled was 1,100 m.p.h. over a 10,000-foot track at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif.

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
