

Robinson, Campy, Podres Spark Dodgers To Victory

BROOKLYN — Sparked by the running of Jackie Robinson, the clouting of Roy Campanella and the pitching of Johnny Podres, the Dodgers were back in high spirits today confident they have a real chance to overtake the New York Yankees and become the first Brooklyn club to win a world Series.

Yesterday's convincing 8-3 triumph over their arch tormentors roused the previously dormant Dodgers.

This "must" victory, bolstered by the majority of the 34,209 spectators, saved the National League champions from almost certain extinction and reduced the Yankees' lead to 2 to 1 in the best 4-of-7 series.

Another capacity crowd of some 34,000 was expected to view the fourth game today with Brooklyn's Carl Erskine, a World Series veteran, opposing Don Larsen. Both are righthanders. Erskine, hampered most of the season with a sore elbow, posted a 1-8 season record.

The Dodgers' new-born confidence has rubbed off on the oddsmakers who have installed them 7 to 5 favorites to win today's game and, deadlocked the series at two games each. The Yankees, however, remain favored to win the series.

Back amid the familiar surroundings of Ebbets Field where they hit 119 home runs in 77 games during the regular season, the Dodgers for the first time showed the awesome power that crushed all National League opposition.

The sight of the friendly fences undoubtedly sharpened the batting eye of Campanella, heretofore the hitting "zoat" of the series. The robust catcher fired the opening salute against Bullet Bob Turley, the Yankee starter and loser, with a first inning two-run homer.

Campanella, who had gone 0 for 8 in the first two games, added a double and single to pace the Dodgers' 11-hit attack against four Yankee pitchers.

Podres celebrated his 23rd birthday with a sparkling seven-hitter.

Southern Cal Stops Texans By 19-7

LOS ANGELES — The Texas Longhorns flew back home Saturday, beaten off in a gallant attempt to whip the heavily favored Trojans of Southern California.

The score was 19-7, unrevealed before 61,966 fans in Memorial Coliseum Friday night, and few of the witnesses left until late in the fourth quarter.

That was when the bench-deep Trojans put over the clinching touchdown and nullified Texas' threat to overhaul the big Coast Conference machine.

The Texas aerial arm, in the person of sophomore quarterback Joe Clements, the nation's leading passer and total yardage gainer, was struck down in the first few minutes of the game.

Clements was hit in the head,

and while he left the field on his own power, he remained on the bench from then on. Team doctors said he suffered a "mild concussion."

Another 19-year-old sophomore, Walt Fondren of Houston, kept the Trojans in a stew, rushing for 60 yards, and scoring from two yards out after gaining 38 on one of the six passes completed by Texas.

Halfback Jon Arnett of USC, leading the country in rushing going into the game, was a constant threat. But he was held to 38 yards running and it was left to fullbacks Gordy Duvall, with 84 yards, and C.R. Roberts, with 42, to dominate the statistics sheet.

Arnett's big moment was a 62-yard kickoff return. But the brilliant display went for naught on the scoreboard. Texas stopped the scoring threat.

This was Texas' first appearance in California and first game with USC.

Duvall scored twice, once on a 5-yard gain that ended a 76-yard march, and again on a 25-yard screen pass from quarterback Jim Conratto.

Roberts blasted 19 yards and then the final nine on a pitchout, ending a 94-yard parade, for the other USC score.

Texas didn't complete a pass until the third quarter. Third string thrower Dick Miller got hot enough to hit end Menan Schriewer for 15 and 13 and then arch one for 36 to Fondren. It carried one to the nine. Fondren scored soon afterward.
