

Fire Destroys Highway Cafe Near Oakridge

OAKRIDGE, Ore. — Fire destroyed a highway cafe, a television store and the home of the cafe owner a half-mile east of Oakridge Monday night.

Owner Ray Jamison estimated the loss at \$70,000. He said \$10,000 of the loss was covered by insurance.

The fire was believed to have started around electric switches at the rear of the cafe shortly before 10 p.m. The Oakridge volunteer fire department and two fire crews from the Pope and Talbot sawmill fought the flames. By spraying

water, they kept flames from spreading to a nearby service station.

Ernie Jones, Oakridge, was overcome by smoke. First aid revived him, and he did not go to a hospital.

Russian Musician Given Acclaim In Philadelphia

PHILADELPHIA — Pianist Emil Gilels, 39, the first Russian musician to visit this country in six years, won immediate acclaim Monday night in his debut at Philadelphia's Academy of Music.

Gilels, performing Tchaikovsky's Concerto No. 1 in B Flat Minor with conductor Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia Orchestra, completely captured his audience and drew high praise from the critics.

He is on a monthlong tour of American cities.
