LOS ANGELES (AP) — An Atomic Energy Commission official says the AEC is looking toward the Western United States for increased uranium output.

Assistant chief Dudley L. Davis of the AEC Exploration Branch, Salt Lake City, addressed 350 mineralogists and geologists at a uranium conference Saturday. He said major discoveries of radioactive ores in Washington State have forced revision of earlier beliefs that the best ore deposits were on the Colorado Plateau.

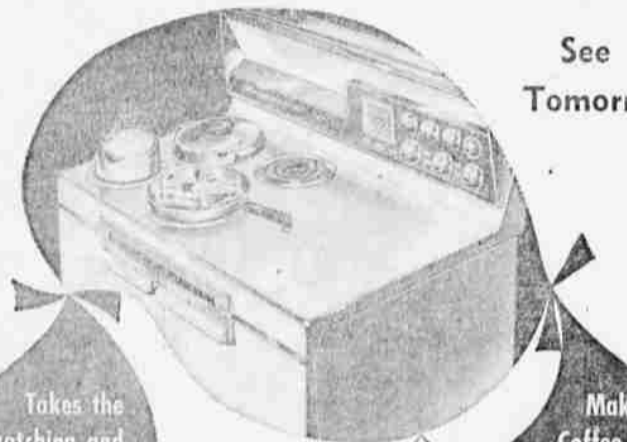
