

Bruces Eddy And Penny Cliff Dams Would Absorb Surplus

PORTLAND (AP) — Dams at the Bruce Eddy and Penny Cliff sites on the Clearwater River likely will be recommended to make up for loss of flood water storage at John Day Dam on the Columbia.

That was reported Wednesday at the North Pacific Division office of the Army Engineers.

The John Day Dam had been projected as a high dam of 292 feet capable of storing two million acre feet of water for flood control. When opposition developed, a revised height of 262 was adopted. This would store only a half million acre feet.

Last month the Board of Review for Rivers and Harbors refused to approve the lower dam, saying it was necessary first to find some substitute storage locations. That rejection was received here Wednesday.

Brig. Gen. Louis H. Foote, North Pacific commander, was out of the city Wednesday, but F. S. Brown, chief of the engineering division, said it was virtually certain that the Bruce Eddy and Penny Cliff sites would be recommended as

feasible, where dams could store 3,733,000 acre feet.

He said other sites would be named too, but since the engineers earlier had proposed that Congress approve the two Clearwater sites, it seemed probable they would get the first firm recommendation as storage substitutes for John Day.

The John Day Dam proposal, with substitute storage sites, is to be returned to the Rivers and Harbors Board in time for its January meeting. Approval then will allow advance planning on the dam. Funds for that are already available.

A four-member private utility group has applied for a permit from the Federal Power Commission to take preliminary steps at Bruce Eddy and Penny Cliff. That was done soon after the Army Engineers issued a report saying they were feasible.

The storage report to the Board of Rivers and Harbors will make no reference to who might build the dams, engineers said.

Free Enterprise System School Program Sought

GEARHART, Ore. (AP) — Plans for a public grade school program to teach "the basic story of the American free enterprise system" were described at Tuesday's meeting of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, better business relations conference.

Cyril W. Platte, manager of General Mills public relations department, said his firm has a program aimed at students from kindergarten through the seventh grade.

The program, which covers such subjects as "freedom of choice," "marketing" and "interdependence," has passed through nine years of research and now is in the experimental stage, he said.

Platte reported that three workshops have been set up to educate teachers in ways of presenting the new subject. Teachers' manuals also have been prepared, he said.

The conference will end Thursday.

Israel's Second Oil Well Gushes In Wednesday

HELETZ-HULEIKAT, Israel (AP) — Israel's second oil well, gushing 250 feet high, came in Wednesday in the field developing near the Egyptian-held Gaza strip.

The oil is "a lower and thicker stratum than the source of the first well, brought in Sept. 22.

A geologist said nothing final could be said yet on the extent of the Heletz-Huleikat field but that he thought "it is not small." He added that seismic studies indicate development of about 100 wells in the area is "not impossible."

Seattle Radio Station Seeks Portland's KXL

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mount Rainier Radio and Television Broadcasting Corp. Monday asked the Federal Communications Commission for permission to buy Portland radio station KXL for \$450,000.

Mount Rainier, which now operates radio station KJR in Seattle, also asked a permit to buy Hamilton, Mo., radio station KHMO for \$82,250.

Lester M. Smith, whose wife has been general manager of KHMO since early this year, is president of Mt. Rainier.
