

Student Exchange Program Importance Told To Rotary

The value and growth of foreign student exchange programs was explained at a Roseburg Rotary Club meeting Thursday noon at the Hotel Umpqua.

Guest speaker was Dr. Kenneth S. Ghent, associate professor of mathematics at the University of Oregon and the school's foreign student adviser.

The importance of the various exchange programs, whereby Americans study abroad and foreigners study here, is due primarily to the great contribution toward understanding and the spread of knowledge throughout the world, Dr. Ghent said.

The direct contact with people of another nation is a very strong force in solving world problems, the speaker maintained.

At the University of Oregon this year, there are 137 foreign students from 41 other countries. Dr. Ghent told of the program and how it works. He also outlined various programs, such as the one providing Fulbright scholarships.

The speaker was introduced by Cliff Norris, chairman of the Rotary Foundation committee of the local club. Norris told of the growth of Rotary's own exchange program whereby college graduates are chosen for one-year study

in a country with expenses paid. Rotary has sponsored 606 young people since 1947. The foundation fund now contains about 3½ million dollars. This year, the district which includes Roseburg will choose a recipient of a scholarship. The district includes all of Oregon and southern Washington, and an exchange student is chosen from the district every other year.

Norris was introduced by program chairman Bill Carstens. President Harold Hoyt announced that District Gov. Alton F. Baker of Eugene will visit the local club on Oct. 26-27.

Recent additions to the club's membership include Dr. James Finlay, Gene Foley, Don Naden and Arthur Judd.

Big Jet Airplane Contract Awarded

NEW YORK (AP) — The biggest contract by an American company for purchase of jet transport planes was announced by Pan American World Airways Thursday.

Juan T. Trippe, president of the firm, said the board of directors have approved the purchase of 269 million dollars worth of jet transports from Boeing Airplane Co. and Douglas Aircraft Co. which will use engines from the Pratt & Whitney division of United Aircraft Corp.

William M. Allen, president of Boeing, said his company's contract "marks the beginning of a new era in air transportation."

"Most major cities of the free world will be only 12 hours or less from the United States," he said. Twenty of the 45 aircraft will be delivered by Boeing between December 1948 and November 1959, while delivery of 25 Douglas jet clippers will begin in December 1959 with the last delivery due January 1961.
