Rev. Steele Will Speak Tonight At Lookingglass

The Rev. E. V. Steele, founder and director of the World Mission for Children, will be speaker tonight at a missionary rally at Lookingglass Community Church at 7:30.

The Rev. Mr. Steele conceived the movement while serving a five-year term in a Nazi concentration camp during World War II. There, he saw the suffering of children.

Since the organization's founding, 20 missionaries have been assigned in Austria, Ireland, Japan and India.

The first missionaries in the program were Mr. and Mrs. Bob Minter of Kellogg. Parents of both still live there.

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Mobile Crane Careens Wildly, Injuring Eight

SNOQUALMIE PASS, Wash. — Eight persons were injured, one critically, Monday when a huge mobile crane careened wildly out of control down a construction area on the Snoqualmie Pass Highway.

Described as in critical condition in Nelems Memorial Hospital at North Bend was Mrs. Violet Base, 37, of Seattle, who suffered fractured legs and severe cuts when her car was smashed into a twisted pile of metal.

Mrs. Base and a passenger, Melvin Ferris, 20, of Kent, Wash., who suffered cuts and bruises, were thrown from the car when the crane crushed it on its wild race down the highway.

"It's a good thing they were, too," commented State Patrolman William Milliken, who witnessed the mishap. "Their car was an awful mess."

Besides the Base car, the crane smashed two other cars and two trucks, including a truck-trailer rig owned by Southern Freightways of Vancouver, B.C.
