STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—The Swedish Foreign Office will never forget Ambassador Danny Kaye, the conservative newspaper Svenska Dagbladet exclaimed in big headlines Friday.

The U.S. movie actor is visiting Sweden in connection with the first local showing of "Assignment Children," the film he made for the U.N. International Children's Emergency Fund.

Kaye was invited to the dignified Swedish Foreign Office for lunch. He joked with everybody, kissed young secretaries, gave them the day off and tried to sit in Foreign Minister Oesten Unden's chair "in order to direct Sweden's foreign policy." His hosts denied him the chair, however.
