Myrtle Creek Board Members Schedule Meet

Douglas County school board members will meet in a "double barreled" session Monday night in Myrtle Creek.

They've been called to attend a county-wide convention as directed by the Oregon Legislature in House Joint Resolution No. 19. Simultaneously, they'll be attending the fall meeting of the regularly functioning County School Board Assn.

The convention is requested by the Legislature so that each county may let it know what its chief educational problems are. The resolution directs county school Supt. Kenneth F. Barneburg to call the session on or before Nov. 1, 1955. It will be held in the Myrtle Creek school cafeteria, starting at 6:30 with dinner.

This first convention gathering is for organization. Supt. Barneburg said Tuesday. The board members will select an agenda, decide how they'll break down the work on it, later formulate the responses and then forward them to the Legislature's state interim committee on or before July 1, 1956.

The interim group then will comb the suggestions from each county, and from them formulate legislation for the next state session.

Albert C. Norris, former Douglas County resident who had lived for 73 years in Oregon, died in Eugene Tuesday, following a short illness. He was 83 years old.

Born Feb. 25, 1872, in Frankfort, Ind., he crossed the plains in a covered wagon at the age of 10. His father drowned en route.

The family settled in Eastern Oregon. In 1900 he came to Douglas County and resided in different communities for nearly 27 years. He moved to Junction City in 1927, and made his home there until his death.

He was married to Eliza Cook

on Aug. 2, 1905, in Oakland. He was a member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church of Junction City.

Survivors include his wife Eliza, Junction City; four daughters: Mrs. Ethel Sanders, Roseburg; Mrs. Byron (Gladys) Fox, Junction City; Mrs. Vernon (Dorothy) Sphers, Wood, Calif.; and Mrs. Dale (Lucille) Tallaferro, Eugene; three sons: Harold, Eugene; and Glenn and Chester, both of Junction City; numerous nieces and nephews in Douglas County; 19 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

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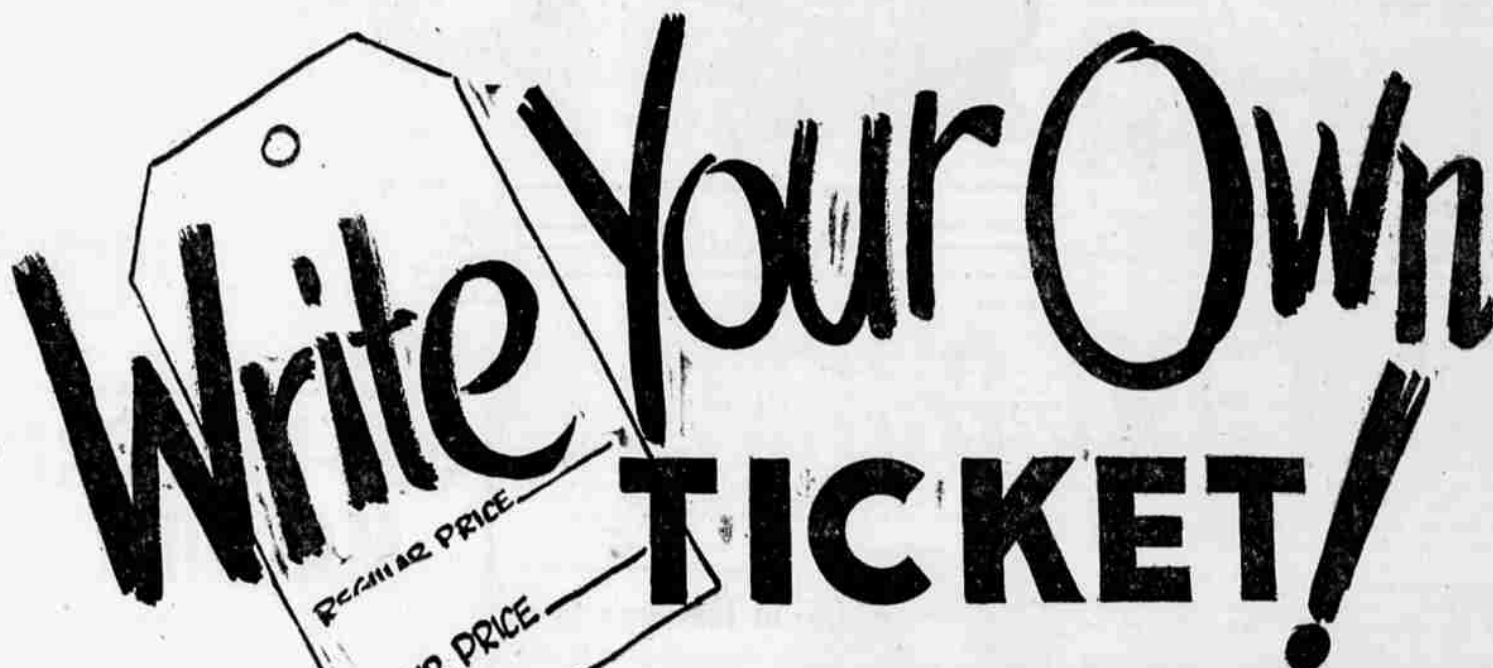

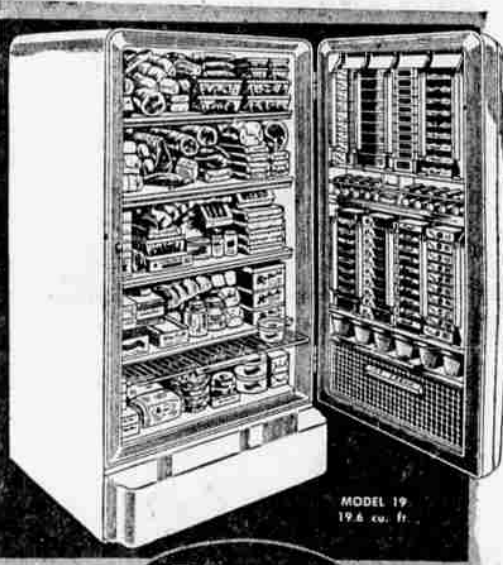
