**PORTLAND UP**—Automatic traffic control gates for Portland's three downtown bridges were approved this week by Multnomah County Commissioners.  
 The gates, to be installed on the Broadway, Burnside and Hawthorne bridges at an estimated cost of \$21,800, will eliminate the employment of seven bridge gate tenders and save more than \$100,000 a year, the commissioners reported.
