

Companions Of Song Will Appear In Concert Sunday

The Companions of Song (Les Compagnons de la Chanson) who will appear in concert in Roseburg Sunday, are on their seventh visit to America and are making their second concert tour of the United States.

This group of nine young Frenchmen, who have been acclaimed on Broadway, in night clubs and television, as well as in the concert field, will make their Roseburg appearance in the Central Junior High School auditorium at 3:15 p.m.

They are scheduled to present a program of their specialties, which will be principally in English but designed to maintain their highly individual Gallic charm and wit, advance announcements state. An added attraction will be the young pianist, Emanueleina Pizzuto, who will be soloist on the same program.

The Companions of Song began their initial career as a unit during World War II in southern occupied France, where they had

gone individually to escape the enemy. Forming an ensemble to earn money, they soon became known throughout the local resistance movement. Following D-Day, they enlisted in the French 1st Army, under General de Lattre de Tassigny. The general, already aware of their reputation, quickly organized them as an entertainment unit for the French army. They were close on the heels of the Germans as they retreated from France. America.

During their frontline entertainment they encountered the internationally celebrated Edith Piaf, who engaged them for her tour of Europe and Egypt. Delighted with their success, Miss Piaf wanted to record with them. Their song, "The Three Belles," sold over a million copies.

Edith Piaf brought the Companions to New York in 1947, and they were an instant hit. Upped to star billing on their own, they toured for America's prestige nightclub circuit. They have since toured nationwide, covering every important supperclub in the country. They are known not only for their sophisticated songs, but for their spirited, haunting folklore. They also rate high on the Angel Columbia Records sales sheets.

Television appearances on such shows as Ed Sullivan's "Toast of the Town" have increased their United States public.

Solo pianist Emanueleina Pizzuto will bring another note of charm and artistry to the musical evening. This attractive young lady, who has been heard in solo concerts in the East and South, and has appeared on weekly concert programs in New York, Philadelphia and Boston.

French Authorize Faure To Request Confidence Vote

PARIS — The French government Wednesday authorized Premier Faure to ask for a vote of confidence Wednesday night during debate on the government's financial and military plans.

The premier will decide whether to use this weapon as the debate develops and he forms an idea of the government's chances of winning approval of its program without a confidence vote.

The discussion is believed to carry some danger to the government. In the face of a series of reversals for French policy on various fronts, deputies are restless and inclined to blame Faure and his ministers.

Closely linked to the debate is the premier's proposal for an advanced date for parliamentary elections. Deputies who are opposed to this idea would like to remove Faure—but on another issue.

The debate is on a question by Socialist Christian Pineau on what the government plans to propose to the Assembly to cover the expenses of heavy military operations in North Africa.

'The \$64,000 Question' To Be Aired On KRNR

The top-rated show in television across the country, "The \$64,000 Question," will soon become a radio feature on CBS and KRNR.

It will be aired over KRNR for the first time Tuesday, Nov. 1 between 7 and 7:30 p.m. On this program, each contestant starts at \$64, doubles as he goes along until he either fails to answer correctly or answers a total of 11 questions for the \$64,000. Only one person has tried for the 11th question.

A host of church and Parent Teacher Assn. groups have taken on the job of canvassing Douglas County to gather information to be included in the forthcoming county directory.

The Women's Society of Christian Service of the First Methodist Church in Roseburg began its canvass today. Sutherland's canvass is virtually complete. Drain and Riddle PTAs started working this week on the enumerations. R. W. Davis, representative of T. W. Salisbury & Co., Portland, said canvassing will start about the first of November in Oakland, Myrtle Creek, the lower Umpqua basin and Glendale.

The company is working in conjunction with chambers of commerce. The directory company will make available free space in the directory to the chambers to give

general information on their communities.

The information to be secured through personal contacts by the church and PTA groups include: the name of the home owner, his or her spouse and the number of children under 18 years old; occupation of the owner and for whom he works; whether he or she is a householder (head of house) or roomer; address or P.O. box; telephone number; name, occupation and employer of working wives and all offspring over 18 years old whose legal addresses are the home.

Information gathered by the canvassers will be processed in Roseburg and then sent to Portland for publication. Estimated pre-publication cost will be \$40. Post publication cost is expected to be \$50.
