Kin of Umpqua Tribe Passes At Florence. FLORENCE, Ore. — William Siuslaw Dick, 72, last full-blooded descendant of the Indians who lived in the Lower Siuslaw Valley when the white man arrived, is dead.

Known familiarly as Uncle Billy, in his early years he cleared land for settlers. More recently he was employed on log booms but illness forced him into retirement last year.

Funeral services were held for him Monday.

His mother was a member of the Umpqua tribe and his father, Siuslaw Dick, was a council member of the Siuslaws and took a leading role in parleys with the whites.

Dr. Edna Landros Scheduled To Speak At Woman's Club Meet

Dr. Edna Landros, noted teacher, linguist, writer and speaker, will be the guest speaker at the meeting of the Roseburg Woman's Club Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. at the clubhouse on Mosher Street. She will talk on "Ballots and Ballyhoo."

Dr. Landros was a member of the faculty of the University of Oregon as an assistant professor of classical languages from 1928 until 1955. She is known throughout the state for her activities in politics, education and women's groups and social problem organizations. She has served as a delegate from Oregon to UNESCO in San Francisco.

She has been state president of the Oregon League of Women Voters and delegate to the national convention; state board member of the American Assn. of University Women and a delegate to its national convention; president of the Classical Assn. of Pacific States; evaluator of the International Toastmistresses Club, and is currently involved in the revision

or replacement of the Oregon Constitution.

Dr. Landros holds degrees from four colleges: the University of Kansas, University of Arizona, the University of Oregon and the National University of Mexico. She has done graduate work at Harvard, the University of California, and the University of Chicago.

Dr. Landros is scheduled for a radio appearance over a local station Tuesday at noon.

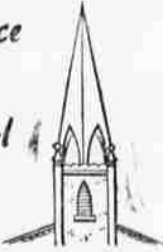
