## Chinese People Face Doublecross By Communists

TOKYO (AP) — Red China, driving for international power, is squeezing its peasants harder than ever to raise capital for industrialization, experts here believe. It is plowing ahead rapidly with a frequently-interrupted farm collectivization program. Peiping Radio is now carrying thousands of words weekly on its progress.

Analysts, who study these voluminous reports and ask anonymity, feel a new intensity of development is underway. Famine—no novelty in China—and minor sporadic uprisings are among the possible consequences, they say. However, nothing remotely comparable to the chaos of the Russian collectivization movement in the 1930s, is anticipated.

Nevertheless, the Chinese farmer is caught in the middle of what is perhaps communism's greatest doublecross. As one expert put it: "The peasant, lured by promises of land, often gave at least tacit support to the Communist revolution. He got land, but now he is probably going to lose it. He may become a mere wage earner."

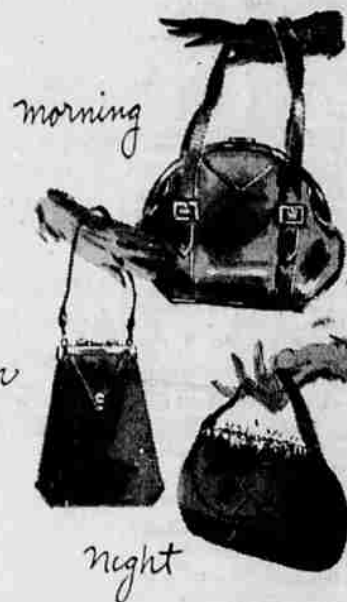
