Ballot Title For Coastal Streams Ban Prepared

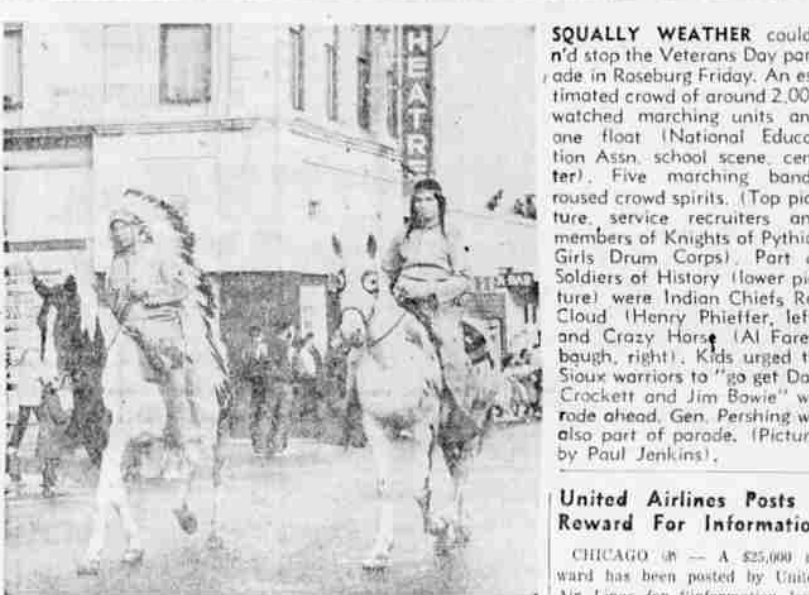
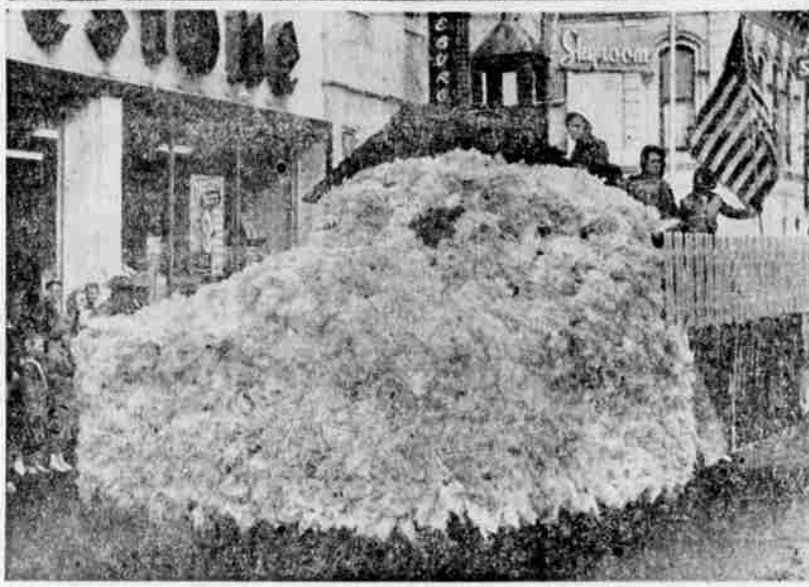
SALEM — Ballot title for the initiative measure to ban commercial fishing in coastal streams was prepared Thursday by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton.

The measure will be distributed to obtain signatures to put it on the general election ballot next November.

The title says: "To prohibit any person from fishing for salmon or steelhead by any method except hook and line in any coastal stream south of the Columbia River. Imposing penalties. Commercial chum salmon fishing and incidental catch of other species permitted in Tillamook Bay area."

Cop-Killer Gets Death Sentence In Quick Action

CHICAGO — The bizarre five-day trial of cop-killer Richard Carpenter was ended last night by a quick verdict condemning him to death in the electric chair.

In an hour and 15 minutes of deliberation, a jury of eight men and four women found the 26-year-old gunman guilty of murdering detective William J. Murphy as the officer tried to arrest him for robbery Aug. 15.

After killing Murphy, 34, the trigger-happy Carpenter shot and wounded another policeman and held a terrorized family captive for 23 hours during one of Chicago's biggest manhunts.

He also is charged with murdering a radio disc jockey last year. Carpenter, who marked his trial by staging a hunger strike, screaming, rolling on the courtroom floor and fighting his guards, heard the verdict quietly and with out emotion.

But he returned to his old-type behavior while he was being led from the courtroom. Despite leg-irons and handcuffs, he kicked and scuffled with bailiffs until they overpowered him and took him away to his cell.

The gunman refused to talk with newsmen after the trial. Murphy's widow said she felt "justified" over the verdict.

One of the slain detective's partners, John Bosquette, said, "I'll be glad when he hits the seat of the electric chair. It should make another fellow think before he tries to take a policeman's life."

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Employees Assn. Votes Against AFL Affiliation

PENDELTON — The Oregon State Employees Assn. went on toward more decisions Friday after voting against affiliation with the American Federation of Labor Thursday.

More resolutions and a speech by Charles W. Terry, state director of the Civil Service Commission, were on schedule.

The decision against the AFL came after the group rejected an AFL representative's request to speak. Leo Butts, appearing for an AFL union of public employees, had asked an hour's time.

Improved retirement benefits were asked by delegates, who also accepted a retirement committee report. That report, presented by P. M. Brant, head of the dairy department at Oregon State College, and committee director, asked:

Group life insurance and group medical service for retired workers; retirement after 30 years of service or after 60 years of age; and a continued study on a proposal for death benefits for retired persons.

More than 200 persons attended the first day of the meeting. Ed Chidsey, Salem, was acting president for the session.

Martin, Lewis Change TV Show Name In Threat

HOLLYWOOD — Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis chafed up a new first today — they have been threatened with legal action on a satire they haven't even done yet.

The two comics confirmed a report that a skit satirizing television's "Late, late, late movie" had brought them threats already although the skit will not be performed until Sunday night on NBC-TV's variety hour (8 p.m., EST). "It's setting so you can't say 'Hello' on television any more without the telephone company claiming 'that's our line,'" quipped Dean.

Boxcar Supply Rose Last Week

SALEM — The freight car supply at Western Oregon lumber shipping points rose last week to 72 per cent of the cars ordered, Public Utilities Commissioner Charles H. Heltzel reported Friday.

That was the highest percentage in two months, and compares with 67 per cent in the preceding week.

The improvement, Heltzel says, results from the fact that the demand for cars is dropping steadily, and because the Southern Pacific Railroad is supplying more cars.

During last week, the lumber shippers ordered 5,162 cars from the SP, or 333 fewer than in the preceding week. They received 3,709 cars, or 40 more than in the previous week.
