Troops, Police Use Tear Gas

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP)—Troops and police using tear gas shells dispersed 200 Cyprus schoolboys demonstrating at a Greek Orthodox Church here Tuesday in favor of union with Greece.

The demonstrators set up a clamor by ringing the church bells. Police and troops ordered the boys to disperse. The youths refused and began throwing stones. Troop reinforcements arrived and dropped tear gas shells among the demonstrators, forcing them to flee.

One young man carrying a catapult and stones was arrested. The incident occurred less than 24 hours after a mob of youths assaulted Col. Joseph Chamberlain son of the late British foreign secretary Sir Austen Chamberlain.

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Something Rotten, States Pauling Of State Dept.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Dr. Linus C. Pauling, one of this nation's outstanding scientists, said Tuesday he felt there was "something rotten" in the State Department's Passport Division after a three-year running battle with that agency.

Pauling, a Nobel Prize winner, related his passport troubles to a Senate subcommittee on constitutional rights which is looking into the denial of passports to some American citizens.

Earlier, a group of scientists urged that Congress lay down rules under which an American could be denied a passport for travel abroad only "for reasons clearly relevant to national security."

Pauling said he never was "a Communist of any sort" but that the Passport Division three times in the years 1952-54 had denied him passport privileges on the ground that letting him go abroad wasn't "in the best interests of the United States."

It wasn't until last fall when he was awarded the Nobel Prize, Pauling said, that the division got around to issuing him an unexpired passport.

And this action, he said, came one month after it had finally turned him down, saying the State Department had concluded that the evidence showed he had "consistently followed the Communist line since World War II."

The 54-year-old scientist, head of the chemistry department at California Institute of Technology, denied that he ever followed the Communist line "or any line."

Money Not In Sight For Bridge At Astoria

ASTORIA (AP)—Local groups backing a bridge across the Columbia River here said Tuesday the State Highway Commission had reported neither state nor federal money is currently in sight to help meet the cost.

The Port Commission and other groups had asked what help might be available. The answer, they said, was that as things stand now, there seems to be no way of offering either state or federal money help.

Richard Griffith of the Fish and Wildlife Service's refuge branch said development of the surrounding Columbia Basin reclamation project has removed some of the refuge's value as a federal undertaking.

He said the state has agreed to take over administration of the program to preserve its remaining wildlife values. Title to the property remains with the federal government.

The tract was first set up in 1936 as the Lenore Lake Migratory Bird Refuge but four years later was redesignated a national wildlife refuge. Under state administration, it will be known as the Lenore Game Range.
