Southwest Conference May Drop A & M Ban

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — President Bernie Green of the Sugar Bowl Friday welcomed reports that the Southwest Conference may relax its ruling which bans Texas A&M from bowl participation.

The Aggies were banned from bowls by the conference for their recruiting practices. A source close to the Gator Bowl in Jacksonville, Fla., said the restriction might be lifted, however.

Dr. E. D. Mouton Jr., president of the Southwest Conference, said in Dallas that he knew of no such plans, but that if the ban were lifted A&M could play in the Cotton Bowl if it wins the conference title as expected.

If the Aggies were permitted to play and went to the Cotton Bowl, Green said, "We would be glad because it would make Texas Christian University eligible for the Sugar Bowl."

TCU, beaten only by A&M, is expected to be runnerup to the Aggies and would fill the host's spot in the Cotton Bowl if A&M remains ineligible.
