Building permits in Sutherlin during September and October totaled \$81,700, according to Building Inspecting Inspector J. C. Irwin.

Four permits for new dwellings were for \$66,000. Also issued were 14 remodel and repair permits totaling \$16,700, according to the Sutherlin Sun.

## Net Farm Income May Drop In '55

WASHINGTON (AP)—Total farm net income this year may be 10 per cent below 1954 and some further decline is in prospect for 1956, the Agriculture Department said. This, the department said, contrasts with increasing income in the non-agricultural sector of the U. S. economy.

The department said that, with production expenses up, farm operators' net income for all of 1955 may total about \$10,600,000,000 compared with \$11,800,000,000 for 1954.

Farmers' cash receipts for 1955 are expected to be down about one billion dollars from the 30 billion plus received last year.

Cash receipts from livestock products in 1955 may total as much as this year if farmers end the current expansion in hog production, the department said. Receipts from dairy products may be a little larger in 1955, it added, but crop receipts are expected to be smaller.

Although farm production expenses may be down slightly next year, the department said, it is unlikely this will offset significantly the expected drop in gross income.

## Explosion Demolishes Butler U. Frat House

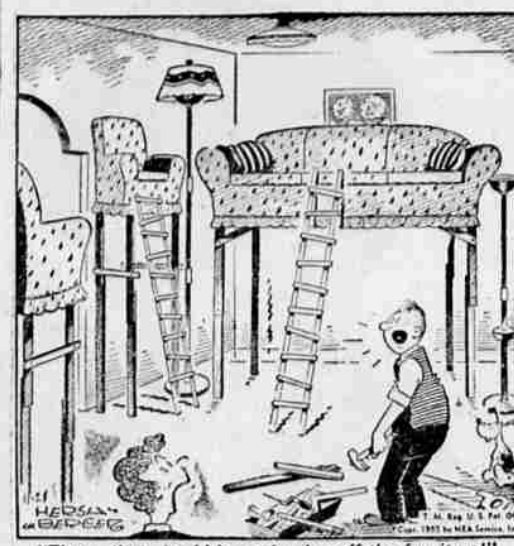
INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—An explosion demolished the \$155,000 Sigma Chi fraternity house at Butler University here early Saturday, injuring seven persons.

Six of the seven injured were treated in hospitals and released. The seventh was kept in a hospital but was not hurt seriously.

Firemen and police said the 5-year-old building was a total loss. They said a 1,000-gallon water tank, installed only Friday, apparently exploded.

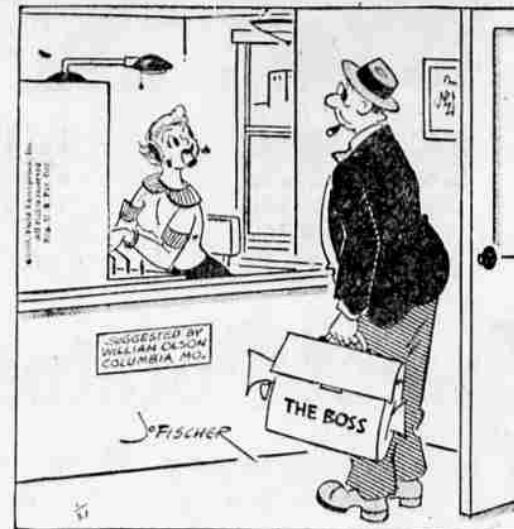
University officials had extended the fraternity's nightly curfew Friday night for a dance, and about half of the student-members were still away from the building or the casualty list might have been larger.
