No charges have been filed.

British Train Accident Takes 10 Persons Lives

MILTON, England (AP)—At least 100 persons were dead Monday and more than 100 injured following a derailment which turned three coaches of a Wales-to-London excursion train into a death trap. A search crew of more than 500 pulled the wreckage apart throughout the night, finding the bodies of nine women and one man. At least 30 of the injured remained in critical condition. The train was carrying 290 excursionists from cities in South Wales, bound for an outing in the British capital. OREGON CITY (AP)—Tony E. Warre suffered only minor injuries despite falling out of a fast-moving automobile, being dragged 50 feet, and then being run over at the neck by a rear wheel. The 27-year-old Estacada man was on his feet and walking when police arrived to investigate. They sent him to a hospital for treatment of cuts, bruises and possible rib fractures. George Hull, 17, a passenger, said that Warre was driving the car about 70 miles an hour when the door flew open and Warre fell part way out.

12 Bodies Being Brought From High Mountain

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—Horses and men labored in freeing weathered on the snow-covered slopes of Mt. Charleston today to finish bringing out the bodies of 14 men killed in the crash of an Air Force transport. Twelve bodies were brought down on horseback last night. Ambulances took them to the Nellis Air Force Base near Las Vegas for identification. Lt. Leo G. Piper of the Air Force said it is expected the remaining two bodies will be recovered today. The C-34 plane crashed Thursday at the 11,300-foot level as it was en route from Burbank, Calif., to the Nevada atomic testing ground. The 14 aboard included five Air Force men, five Air Force civilian workers, two aviation engineers and two consultants.

Sanitarian Irv Reiersen, a Douglas County vector control officer, and Fred Lamoureux report that a former Douglas County health department member, LaVerne Miller, was elected an officer of the association. Miller is secretary-treasurer. He is now a state health department employee. Milton Buhler, Eugene, was elected president. Approximately 22 persons attended the two day meet, Nov. 17-18. Major task of the group is to plot ways and means of killing more mosquitoes, Lamoureux said. The unique problem of Douglas County, control of mosquitoes infesting mill ponds, was discussed at the session. In no other part of the country does such a problem confront residents.
