Morse Claims 'Partnership' Plan Would Stifle Private Enterprise At Co-op Meet

HEPPNER — Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) told the annual meeting of the Columbia Electric Co-op here that the "partnership" power program would "stifle" private enterprise.

He said the federal systems provide private industry with cheap and plentiful electric power but that partnership power is sold to a small market at high prices. Morse said in his prepared remarks that reference in a speech at Eugene recently by Interior Undersecretary Davis to 27 partnership projects from 1906 to 1953 failed to take note of the nature or size of the projects. Their combined capacity is only a little over 287,000 kilowatts, he said.

More than half, he said, were reclamation projects with the water users listed as the partners. Eight of them, he added, were in Arizona, part of the Salt River irrigation project. Three, he said, are in Oregon, including the C-Canal project in the Klamath project with capacity of 500 kilowatts.

Morse said that "astounding achievement of power generation under partnership" cannot be used seriously in any discussion of meeting major power needs.

"It is my guess," he said, "that you resent—and deeply resent—the loose political charge that the federal power program is a form of socialism. I believe you share my view... that the program is designed to and does provide the power to strengthen private enterprise."

Morse charged that the Republican Party had made a "political issue" of power development. He said:

"I pledge my best efforts to finish it as a political issue."

Morse said the Republican philosophy had led Interior Secretary Douglas McKay and his staff to "peddle half-truths, distortions and misleading promises."

Morse discounted the argument that only where there are large federal power developments is there a power shortage.

"Let me tell you, the senator said, 'that the power shortage is not created by the federal programs, but by the strangulation of federal programs by the Republican brass hats and their allies, the private power companies.'"

Morse told the co-op that if partnership power programs were adopted the Pacific Northwest would be placed in what he called the same position of economic stagnation it was in 25 years ago.

He said that cheap power provided for a balanced economy and told the meeting federal power systems could provide that cheap power.

Touching on the issue of Hells Canyon, Morse predicted "that the people can win... as they won at Grande Coulee."

He said: "The Idaho Power Co. will suffer the same fate as the brandishers of the golden shovel, Messrs. Dixon and Yates."

Former Attorney Faces Indictment

ST. LOUIS — A federal grand jury has charged a former Kansas City attorney with perjury in an income tax case which a government attorney calls "plain, old-fashioned bribery."

The indictment, returned Friday, accused Harry I. Schwimmer of lying when he told the grand jury that \$10,000 he received from a man in tax trouble was a legal fee.

"The government contends the money was not a legal fee, but was a fund for the purpose of bribing and corrupting public officials,"

Wyllis Newcomb, a special assistant to the U. S. Attorney General, said in court.

The charge carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$2,000 fine.

The grand jury has been investigating the handling of tax cases under the Truman administration. Newcomb later told reporters additional indictments are expected and that they will reach the Washington level.

Brothers Pray for Man Who Took Parents Lives

PITTSBURGH — Gerald Lipke, 11, and his brothers John, 7, and Robert, 9, prayed for the man who is accused of killing their parents as they left here for their new home in Portland, Ore.

The parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Lipke Sr., died recently when an airplane crashed near Denver after being sabotaged.

John G. Graham, 23, Denver, confessed the bombing in which the Lipkes and 42 other persons died, the FBI said. Graham since has repudiated the confession.

The Pittsburgh Catholic church newspaper said the three boys and their classmates prayed for the Lipkes and then asked that a special prayer be said for Graham.

The boys went to Portland to live with an aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. William R. Moran.

BAGHDAD, Iraq — Iraq police announced this week they arrested five suspected dynamiters near the French Embassy in Baghdad. Police said they believe the men were sympathizers with the Nationalist movement in Morocco.

Board Of Health Urges Taking Polio Vaccine

PORTLAND — The State Board of Health has urged Oregon residents to have Salk anti-polio vaccine shots.

The incidence of the disease in Oregon remains high with 20 new cases reported last week. The total for the year was reported at 376 cases.

The state has taken only 80,937 cubic centimeters of its commercial quota of 130,737 ccs. And of the 80,937, more than 23,000 ccs remain in drug stores, the board reported.

Another 17,049 ccs were released to Oregon Friday by the National Health Service—50 per cent for commercial use and the rest for public agencies.
