

Five Teams Still Running For 2 Vacant Bowl Berths

Tomorrow is \$333-day for Navy, Mississippi, Georgia Tech, Auburn and Vanderbilt as Sugar and Cotton bowl officials take a last look at the five gridiron contenders before making selections to fill their two remaining lucrative Jan. 2 berths.

Navy, geared for its traditional interservice run-in with Army at Philadelphia, is the pivotal club. Word has it the Middles are favored for the Cotton Bowl opposite Texas Christian.

Favored, that is, if the Middles can dispose of Army again. If Navy accepts the Cotton Bowl invitation expected to follow a Middle victory, it would leave the four South-eastern Conference schools battling to win the Sugar Bowl spot against Pitt.

If Navy declines the bid, or loses to the Cadets, it would leave the Cotton and Sugar bowl selectors switching their bids to the SEC quarter — Ole Miss, Tech, Auburn and Vandy.

The SEC camp generally winds up in New Orleans at the Sugar Bowl, but there's no guarantee.

And there's no guarantee as to who the SEC champ will be either. All four of the bowl hopefuls have a chance.

The Gator Bowl, Sun Bowl and lesser postseason games also hinge

on the outcome of tomorrow's games.
Two bowls already have their pairings made in view of conference tieups. The Rose Bowl matches Michigan State of the Big Ten and UCLA of the Pacific Coast. The Orange Bowl pairs Oklahoma, of the Big Seven, and Maryland of the Atlantic Coast Conference, both unbeaten.

All Four Rate High
All four powers are listed among the top six in the Associated Press poll, with Oklahoma No. 1 and in search of its 29th straight victory in a regular season roundup against Oklahoma A&M tomorrow. The other three already have called it quits until Jan. 2.

Mississippi, beaten by Navy 21-0 in the last Sugar Bowl after winning the SEC crown, looks like a repeater, but Tech, Auburn and Vandy still have a chance. Ole Miss plays Mississippi State in the toughest assignment facing the four bowl hopefuls. Tech plays Georgia, Auburn meets winless Alabama and Vandy faces Tennessee.

Texas Scores Upset
Some of the traditional season-ending games were played yesterday, with Texas delivering a shocker by upsetting Texas A&M 21-6. That left Texas Christian a clear field for the Southwest Conference crown and an unchallenged right to fill the host spot in the Cotton Bowl.

Texas A&M was shooting for its first conference title in 14 years, knowing it couldn't get the bowl berth because of probationary action for violating conference recruiting codes. The conference gave TCU the Cotton Bowl bid last week when it was clear the Frogs could be no worse than runner-up. Now TCU can win the title by beating Southern Methodist tomorrow.

Denver, Wyoming Have Fast Windup
DENVER — Nine points were scored in the final 10 seconds as Denver University defeated Wyoming, 6-3, Thursday to knock the Cowboys out of a tie for the Skyline Conference football crown.

A Wyoming victory seemed assured after Joe Mastrogiovanni booted a field goal from the 17-yard line to put the Cowboys ahead, 3-0.

The ensuing kickoff was called back because the ball fell off the tee. Denver halfback Max Willsey took the next kick on his own 22 and cut to the 30. Hemmed in, he lateraled to Dick Gupion, who sprinted 70 yards for the winning touchdown.

Fans poured onto the field, and Denver waived its conversion try. Glenn R. (Red) Jacoby, Wyoming athletic director, announced he would protest the game, maintaining Willsey was tackled and a whistle blew before the lateral. Officials said no whistle was blown.

Navy Favored To Beat Army

PHILADELPHIA — The Army and Navy meet on the football field tomorrow for the 56th time with the statistics indicating this colorful gridiron classic at Municipal Stadium could well be a test of defensive skill.

Army, a 6½-point underdog, is the nation's No. 1 defensive team. It has yielded only 139.5 yards per game in winning five of eight contests. Navy, last year's 27-30 winner, ranks third defensively. The Middles have given up an average of 169 yards a game while winning six, losing to Notre Dame and tying Duke.

But, as has often been the case, in the heated interservice rivalry, the offense could well rise to unexpected heights.

Welch Toe Healed
Navy's attack is geared to the throwing arm of 165-pound George Welch of Coaldale, Pa., fully recovered from a sore toe that hampered his play in late season games. Navy Coach Eddie Erdelatz calls Welch the greatest quarterback he has ever coached.

Don Hollender, a 187-pounder from Webster, N.Y., and one of the most controversial figures in college football this season, directs the Army attack. A great end last year, he was switched to quarterback, where he has shown greater ability at running the ball than at passing. But figures show he has completed passes for six touchdowns, only two less than Welch.

Coach Blames Team
Hollender has been blamed by some for the Cadets' defeats by Michigan, Syracuse and Yale but veteran Coach Earl (Red) Blaik has placed the blame on mistakes by the entire team.

Both coaches were confident of victory as they led their teams into Municipal Stadium today for brief workouts before retiring to suburban clubs to await game time tomorrow.

The weather prospect was fair and cool with a fast field. That is just what Blaik ordered for his swift backs led by Pat Uebel, who scored all of the Army's touchdowns two years ago in a 20-7 victory and ripped the Middles' line apart in a losing cause last year.

Detroit Halfback Leads Team To Pro Grid Win
DETROIT — Halfback Lew Carpenter, the subject of considerable criticism this season, silenced many of his doubters Thursday by leading the Detroit Lions to a 24-10 National Football League victory over the Green Bay Packers.

Carpenter scored two touchdowns, ran 120 yards from scrimmage and caught five passes for 26 yards in a brilliant one-man show. He broke up the fumble-filled game with an explosive 49-yard run early in the fourth quarter.

The play cracked a 10-all tie and brought the Lions their third victory against seven losses. It also squared Green Bay's record at 5-5 and just about ended all hopes the Packers had for a title in the NFL's Western Division.

Sonny Gandy nailed down the decision for Detroit later in the fourth period by recovering a Green Bay fumble and racing 46 yards for a touchdown.

Seattle Boxer Scores Win Over Californian
VANCOUVER, B.C. — Teddy (Tiger) Hall of Seattle scored a unanimous 10-round decision over Carrol Genshaw of Eureka, Calif., here Thursday night in a one-sided bout.

Hall was a last-minute substitute for Len Walters of Vancouver who was refused permission to appear on the card by the Vancouver Boxing Commission following his knockout in Butte, Mont., last week.

Hall weighed in at 129½ and Genshaw was a pound lighter.

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Irish Have Edge Over Trojans

LOS ANGELES — Notre Dame and Southern California, meeting for the 27th time on the gridiron in an epic series that started in 1926, wind up their 1953 campaign Saturday with the Irish favored to hand the coast team its fifth defeat of the season.

Quarterback Paul Hornung and his teammates of desire, as the invaders have been called, rate at least a one touchdown edge over the Trojans, if not more. Terry Brennan's fighting lads have lost but one game, to Michigan State Oct. 15.

The Irish hold a 17-7-2 margin over the Trojans in the series, but upsets have dotted the rivalry over the years.

A crowd approaching 100,000 is expected to sit in.

Southern California was ground down by UCLA, 17-7, last week for its third straight loss. The Trojans were fired up for UCLA, in what has become perhaps an even more bitter feud than their battles with the Irish.

Whether they can bounce back with sufficient spirit to overcome Notre Dame, currently rated fifth in the nation, remains to be seen.
