Reedsport School Census Goes Up

Another boom center of population released its figures on the 1955 school census and the number there as well as in most other areas of the county was still moving up.

The census figures from Reedsport school district 105 C showed an increase of about 150 over 1954. The official census report of 1955 shows 1,361 youngsters, compared to 1,214 for 1954, according to Mrs. Clyde Nunnally. It was the second highest increase in the last 14 years. In 1948, the increase was 267 for the record high.

Since 1941, the number has more than tripled. That year the number was 419.

Supt. Fred Pilling reports all rooms are now filled at the new Highland School. A total 359 are enrolled.

The census showed no relief in the continuing flood of school children in the district, Pilling said. All age groups from 2 through 5 years showed greater numbers than the number presently enrolled in the first grade.

CHICAGO — More than 1,300 farm youngsters poured into Chicago Saturday for five days of entertainment, sightseeing and fun at the 37th National 4-H Club Congress.

The visitors represent 48 states, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico. As their guests they have club members and youth leaders from Canada and 24 other countries.

One-hundred eighty of the delegates will receive honors for their work in 4-H Club projects. These include \$49,050 worth of college scholarships to national winners in 30 4-H award programs. Eight former 4-H Club members will be honored at an alumni recognition.

The kids won't go hungry away from home. They'll be guests at 17 banquets or dinners, 9 breakfasts and 9 suppers, 6 luncheons, 3 receptions and 1 tea. The companies that underwrite the club projects are entertaining the young participants at the social functions.

Other high spots of the program include the annual 4-H parade at the International Livestock Exposition in the International Amphitheatre Wednesday night, a concert by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and a dance.

BOY, 9, Rescues Six When Fire Hits Home

CHICAGO HEIGHTS, Ill. — Police today credited a 9-year-old boy with saving the lives of six of his brothers and sisters Thursday night in a fire in their home.

Joe Bradley Jr. raced into the burning house several times to carry or lead the children, ranging in age from 2 months to 8 years, to safety. A baby sister, Denise, 15 months, died in the blaze. The family is Negro.

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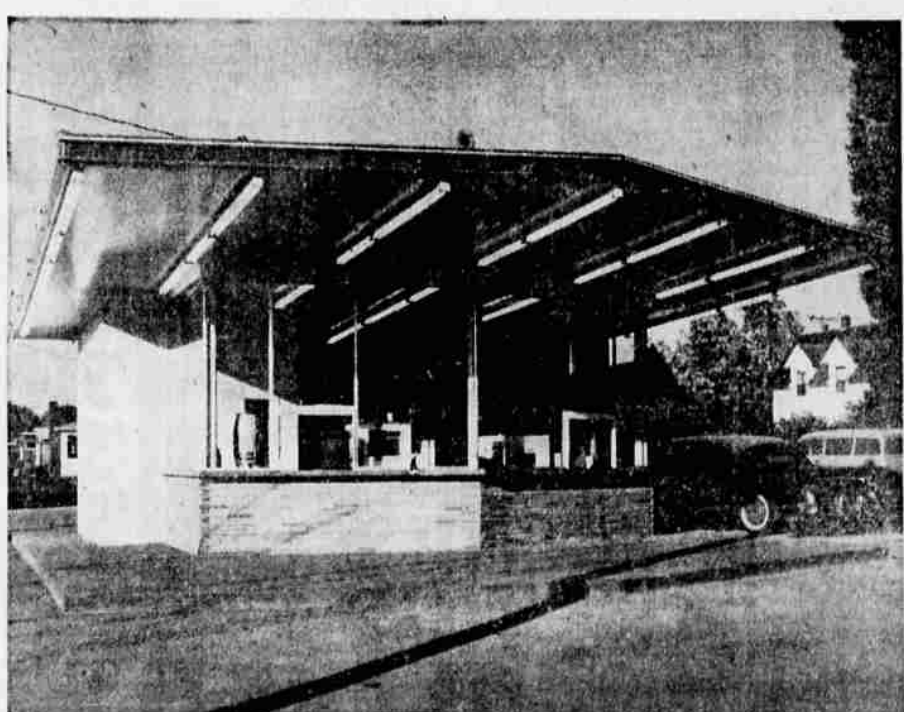
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
