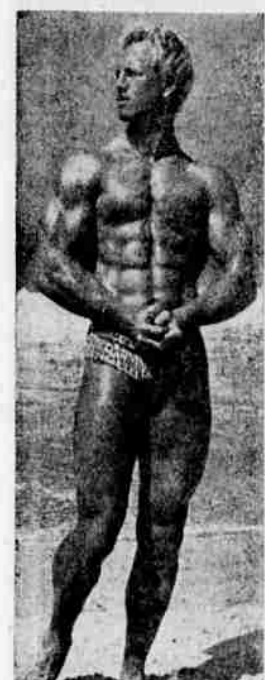


National Hoop Season Set To Get Under Way Tonight

Shavlik take to the courts tonight as another long college basketball season gets under way. Lasalle, Dayton and North Carolina State are just part of the mob that gets the collegians rolling in their first big weekend of the season—but they are the only representatives of the top 10 teams of last season to play tonight.

San Francisco, No. 1 in the final Associated Press poll last season and the NCAA champion, opens tomorrow night against Chicago State.

Lasalle, with three-time All America Gola graduated and now a pro, warms up against Millersville (Pa.) in its opener under new Coach Jim Pollard, the former pro stand-out.

Lasalle, ranked No. 3 behind San Francisco and Kentucky in last season's final poll, got a big jolt yesterday when Bob Maples, one of its returning veterans, broke an ankle in practice. He'll be out two months.

North Carolina State, in good standing after a season on probation by the NCAA, is back in force. The No. 4 team of 1954-55 opens against Florida State with Shavlik, second-team All America, who came into his own in scoring and rebounding, topping a club that lost only two from last season's starting five and is expected to make the big noise in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Dayton, the NIT runner-up and No. 9 in the final poll, is rebounding with Jack Salter and Chris Harris lost by graduation along with Horan. The new squad gets a test from touring Pepperdine tonight.

Carpenter Named As Top Canadian League Player
WINNIPEG, Man. (P) — Ken Carpenter, former Oregon State College halfback, will receive a trophy Saturday as the most valuable player in the Western Interprovincial Football Union.

Now in his second year with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, Carpenter received 43 points in voting by sports writers and broadcasters in the five WIFU cities, 15 more than runner-up Jack Parker of Edmonton, a former Mississippi State player.

Carpenter, who formerly played for the Cleveland Browns, scored 18 touchdowns in the regular season, a record.

He will receive the Jeff Nicklin Memorial Trophy in the first annual East-West Shrine game at Toronto Saturday.

Little All-America Grid '11' Revealed

NEW YORK (P)—The Associated Press' Little College All-America football team for 1955, made up of representatives from 11 different colleges that won a total of 5 games, was named Thursday with a line that averages 210 pounds to the man and boasts the country's leading scorer in the backfield.

Nate Clark of Hillsdale, Mich., is the terrific downhill tailback. He led the collegiate players of the entire country with 144 points and is the only junior among the backfield foursome that also includes Gene (Great) Scott of Centre College, Dave Burnham of Wheaton and Charles Sticka of Trinity College at Hartford, Conn.

Up front are ends Charles Schultz of all-winning Alfred, and Richard Donlin of Hamline, chosen in the second draft of the professional football draft by Baltimore Monday.

The tackle slots are manned by Charles Gibbons of Rhode Island, who will display his ability in the Refrigerator Bowl Sunday, and Vincent Vidas of Drexel's unbeaten team.

Sleeve Myhra of North Dakota University, and Wixie Robinson of Pepperdine at Los Angeles are the guards, flanking Hubert (Duke) Cook of Trinity at San Antonio, Tex.

Clark gathered his 24 touchdowns for a Hillsdale team that romped through nine opponents by an average score of 34-9.

The second team included two players from Washington State's Evergreen Conference.

William VanderStoep of undefeated Whitworth was named center, and Gerry Kluth of Pacific Lutheran placed at guard.

Basilio Retains Welter Crown With TKO Win

BOSTON (P) — Carmen Basilio, the immovable welterweight champion, looked forward to Johnny Saxton today while nursing a sore left hand he acquired in his destruction of rugged Tony DeMarco. Basilio, the 28-year-old Canastota, N. Y., gamester, rallied from DeMarco's stinging punches last night to repeat his June technical knockout of the Boston challenger in the 12th round.

The time was 1:54—just two seconds longer than it had taken him at Syracuse six months earlier. Both fighters weighed 145½ for the nationally televised title scrap at Boston Garden.

Down in 12th
After he had knocked down DeMarco for an eight count with a smashing right to the jaw, then flattened him for good with withering combinations in the 12th, Basilio revealed he had hurt his left hand in the second round.

The contract for the latest match called for the winner to meet Saxton within 60 days.

Crowd Big
A near-capacity crowd of 13,373 paid a local record of \$171,373 to watch what amounted to two fights in one.

DeMarco, calling on his long-range power, took charge in the early rounds and had Basilio wobbling in his corner in the seventh round. It took a near super-

human effort by the ex-Marine from upper New York state to keep from going down for the second time in his professional career.

After he survived the staggering left hook, Basilio grew stronger as he unleashed a battering body attack on a weary DeMarco tiring just as he had done in punching himself out last June.

DeMarco was ahead in rounds on all the officials' cards. Referee Mel Manning had it 6-3-2 on rounds for Tony, Judge Joe Santapio 6-4-1 and Judge Joe Santapio 7-4. The AP had it 5-4-2 for DeMarco.

Special Deer Hunts Open In December

Controlled deer seasons in several areas of eastern Oregon will get under way in December, the Oregon Game Commission reminded permit holders today.

Hunters who drew \$5 permits for the Alfalfa and Newbridge controlled areas will be allowed to take one antlerless deer from Dec. 3 through Dec. 31.

From Dec. 10 through Dec. 14, permit holders will be allowed one antlerless deer in the Northside John Day, Lookout Mountain and Pleasant Ridge areas.

All permits for the above named hunts have been issued with the exception of the Lookout Mountain area where a few of the \$5 tags are still available. The remaining tags will be issued from the game commission's Portland office on a first come, first serve basis.

The only hunts remaining for persons with unused deer tags are the Polk county and Cherry Grove areas in the Willamette Valley. These two extended seasons will run for three weekends during December, December 3-4, 10-11 and 17-18. Hunters with unused deer tags will be allowed to take one deer of either sex.

All controlled and extended seasons were set up to harvest animals that were doing extensive damage to agricultural crops or to harvest surplus animals on over-browsed deer ranges.

Hunters are urged to refer to the game synopsis for the boundary lines of the extended deer season areas.

Brant Season Open Today Along Coast

Waterfowl hunters who want the elite in waterfowl gunning are reminded by the Oregon Game Commission that the season on the Pacific brant opens today and will extend through Feb. 10. Bag limit on the brant is 3 birds per day or in possession.

The black brant, smallest and darkest of our geese, are probably least known and hunted by sportsmen. They are found only along the Pacific coast and are rarely seen far from the sea, marine estuaries or coastal meadows.

Although great sport, they are difficult to hunt unless a person has the proper decoy setup. In addition, there are only a few hours a day when hunting is good. Usually the morning outgoing tides are best for brant shooting.

The name "brant" is often erroneously applied to the small cackling geese of inland waterways. The cackling goose, however, is a miniature of the Canada goose and has a white cheek patch instead of the white streaks around the neck as does the brant.

Black brant come to our coastal bays from the north about the middle of November. The greatest concentrations are found during December, January and February.

Waterfowl connoisseurs rate the flesh of the brant as a table delicacy which excels all other waterfowl.

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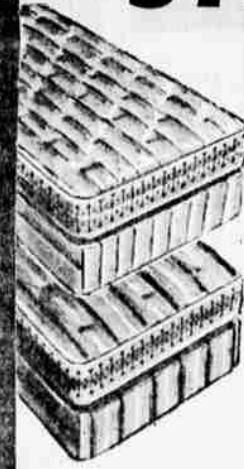
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
