Tiger Center Leads Scorers At Canyonville

Canyonville Bible Academy won the annual Canyonville Jamboree for a second straight year Friday night after defeating Camas Valley and Days Creek and tying Canyonville in the extravaganza.

Each of the four teams participating played the other team in one ten minute quarter for a total of six quarters in all. Camas Valley had two wins and one loss, Canyonville won one, tied one and lost one and Days Creek lost three.

CBA won the turnover in the final round when with 10 seconds to play against Days Creek, Wesley Cole pumped through a two-point for an 11-10 CBA decision.

High individual scorers for the night were Canyonville's center Lynn Boller with 14 points, Camas Valley's Bobby McCellan scored 12 points in three games and had a one-game high of nine, Mike Anastasi scored 11 for CBA and Howard Dunlap had seven for Days Creek.

Berra MVP In ALL; Virdon Top Rookie In National Loop

CHICAGO — Catcher Yogi Berra of the New York Yankees today was named the American League's most valuable player for the second successive year and the third time in his career.

The honor, voted by the Baseball Writers Assn. of America, put Berra in a bracket with Jimmy Fox and Joe DiMaggio, the only other three-time American League winners.

Berra won the award in 1952 and 1953 with Philadelphia and in 1958 with Boston. DiMaggio was the winner in 1939, 1941 and 1947 with the Yankees.

Berra, who also was MVP in 1951 and 1954, became the tenth Yankee to win the award since it was initiated in 1931 with B.O.B. (Lefty) Grove of Philadelphia being awarded the Kenesaw Mountain Landis Trophy.

Outfielders Al Kaline of Detroit and Al Smith of Cleveland finished second and third, respectively, with Boston's Ted Williams in fourth place.

CHICAGO — The St. Louis Cardinals Friday became the first team in baseball to nail down successive rookie of the year awards when outfielder Bill Virdon was named the top newcomer in the National League by the Baseball Writers Assn. of America.

Virdon, 24, succeeds teammate Wally Moon, who was named rookie of the year in 1954. Virdon collected 15 votes while Jack Meyer, Philadelphia pitcher, was named on eight ballots. Don Bessent, Brooklyn relief pitcher, received two votes.

Virdon, who cites two big reasons for his rise to stardom, batted .281 for the Cardinals after being acquired in a trade which sent outfielder Enos (Country) Slaughter to the New York Yankees.

Virdon appeared in 144 games and had 150 hits, including 18 doubles, 6 triples and 17 home runs. He drove in 68 runs.

Bowl Nod Brings School Stiff Fine

LONGVIEW, Wash. — Wenatchee Junior College's acceptance of the Potato Bowl bid cost the school \$500 Friday night and the state Jayvee Athletic Commission indicated the punishment may be stiffened next year.

The Wenatchee school received the \$500 fine for allowing its football team to play in the Bakersfield, Calif., game Saturday despite a conference rule against post-season, nonconference play after Dec. 1, except for the Junior Rose Bowl.

The commission said it would take up the matter of placing Wenatchee on probation or suspending the school from conference athletics at a meeting now scheduled for March 9 at Aberdeen.

The Knights, who won the conference football title this season with a 7-0-1 record, played Bakersfield College in the Potato bowl game.

In other actions, the commission ordered Everett J.C. to forfeit its Sept. 24 game with Olympic because of the use of an ineligible player. Everett won the contest, 13-0.

Gave its permission to football coaches to select an all-star team.

Ducks Sail Over Beavers; Huskies Upset By Stanford

Stanford's Indians, short on height but tall in fight, gave the heavily-favored University of Washington Huskies more basketball than they could handle Friday night to spring the first big upset of the coast basketball campaign.

The towering Huskies went into the game with everyone, except the Indians, figuring they could call their shots as they wished.

But the scrappy Indians left the lumbering Huskies far behind in a 72-55 victory.

The Huskies, figured to be the second best team in the Coast Conference this year, weren't alone in defeat. The favored UCLA Bruins were toppled by inspired Brigham Young, 75-54, at Provo, Utah.

Oregon Gets Win
And at Eugene, Ore., the University of Oregon Ducks showed they were to be reckoned with when conference play gets under way by shutting defending champion Oregon State aside, 57-46.

Oregon State, which lost 11 members of its great 1954-55 championship team through graduation and scholastic troubles, held the lead briefly in the opening minutes and then faded as the Ducks came along fast.

Oregon moved into a 21-19 lead at the end of the first half, toyed with the Webfoots in an early tie, then sparked a second half rally that gave them a safe lead.

Ken Nanson, sophomore guard from Vernonia, led the Oregon State scorers with 16 points. Charlie Franklin, transfer forward from Los Angeles City College, had 12 for Oregon and Dave Gamble from Corvallis, scoring leader of last season's Oregon State Rook team, registered 12.

Oregon led at halftime, 21-19. The teams traded leads in the second half until Johnny Lundell, Oregon guard, hit a field goal. Anderson then dropped in five straight baskets and Franklin added another to put Oregon in front, 40-29. Oregon State never seriously threatened after that.

Drain Aids 'South' In Lane Jamboree
Drain's 23-point scoring spree over Elmira was the evening high team effort as southern teams of district 5-A-2 edged the "north" 60-59 in the league's annual basketball jamboree at Willamette of Eugene Friday night.

The Warriors joined seven other teams in the four-quarter battle that saw each team play once for one ten-minute quarter. The Warriors beat Elmira 23-10.

Drain's win pulled the "South" into a 37-28 lead which the winners held on to win by the final one point margin. In other results, Junction City of the "north" defeated Oakridge 18-14 in the first round, St. Francis of the "north" defeated Pleasant Hill 15-9 and Willamette of the "north" beat Creswell 16-14.

Scoring for Drain was paced by center Virgil Merrill who had nine points; guard Dale Dowdy with six and Bill Levins with four.
