

Khrushchev Launches Tirade On West At Buddhist Shrine

RANGOON, Burma (AP) — From a seat in one of the Buddhist world's most venerated shrines, Nikita S. Khrushchev launched a bitter, impromptu tirade Friday against the "stupidity" of Western nations.

Red-faced with anger and pointing his finger wildly, the Soviet Communist Party Chief said he accused the United States and France of attempting to kidnap Russian architect Alexander V. Vlasov. He also had some derisive words for the British.

Khrushchev spoke out as he rested in the 2,000-year-old Shwe Dagon (Golden Pagoda), after climbing nearly 200 steps to the heart of the famous temple. He and Soviet Premier Bulganin were touring Rangoon shrines on the second day of their week's visit to Burma.

Chatting with Burmese Ambassador to Russia Maung Ohn and accompanying foreign correspondents, Khrushchev admired the temple's few wood carvings, then lashed out.

"There are some very stupid people in America. After we criticized Comrade Vlasov, they tried to persuade him to stay. The French also repeated this stupid mistake the Americans had made."

Vlasov's work was censured by the Soviet government while he was touring the United States and France with other Russian architects.

Khrushchev switched to colonialism, declaring: "We Russians are the only one that are always fighting for the cause against colonialism."

"What about East Germany?" one American correspondent asked. "What about Latvia and Estonia?" asked another.

"You don't know what's going on inside East Germany," Khrushchev replied. "What the East Germans are doing, you would not understand because you are a paid slave writer of capitalism. If you wanted to write something good about Russia, you would starve to death — because the capitalist

Republicans Increasingly Hopeful Ike Will Run

PORTLAND (AP) — Republicans are becoming increasingly hopeful that President Eisenhower will seek re-election, Wendell Wyatt said here on his return from the Republican National Committee meeting at Chicago.

Wyatt, Oregon Republican chairman, told reporters: "I think there is better than a 50-50 chance that he will be a candidate."

The party's state executive committee met Saturday to decide whether to take part in the nationwide "Salute to Ike" dinner program. The dinner has been proposed here to raise funds for Oregon's share of national GOP campaign money.

State Sen. President Elmo Smith, John Day, and Rep. Ed Geary, Klamath Falls, speaker of the Oregon House, were to address Saturday night's committee banquet.

Cuttings From Abandoned Well Put On Display

PORTLAND (AP) — Cuttings from a well drilled by the Sinclair Oil and Gas Co. 15 miles north of Vale will be on display for inspection here Dec. 12.

The well was abandoned as a dry hole last summer after reaching a depth of 4,888 feet.

Sample cuttings for each 10 feet of drilling will be available for inspection by geologists, C. D. Johnson of the company said. This is the usual procedure under a reciprocal exchange of information among companies, he said.

Drilling is continuing on Sinclair's well in Lane County near Mapleton and has now reached 10,247 feet to make it the deepest well ever drilled in the state.

The company has no immediate plans for drilling other wells Johnson said, although it has leases on 400,000 acres in the state.

Oregon May Lose Half Of Anti-Polio Vaccine If Not Used

SALEM (AP) — Oregon may lose more than half of its supply of Salk anti-polio vaccine unless demand for it increases within the next few days, the State Board of Health was warned.

Dr. Harold M. Erickson, the state health officer, said the U. S. Public Health Service wants to reallocate 49,000 of the 79,744 cubic centimeters on hand to other states. In a report to the board he also said a federal agency is seeking another 10,000 centimeters.

The board expressed alarm and warned that "parental indifference" could result in another serious polio outbreak in Oregon next summer.

Dr. Erickson said there will be no more mass public free inoculation programs like that of last summer. The vaccine must be obtained through private physicians.

It takes eight months to complete the shots and obtain full protection, he pointed out, and shots started now will not give full immunity before next July or August, prior to the peak of the polio season.

But, he said, "If enough children receive the protection during the next few months, Oregon may never again suffer another polio epidemic year."

"Salk vaccine has been 100 per cent effective in Oregon and is readily available at nominal cost through private physicians."

Children up to the age of 15 and pregnant women are eligible to receive shots. Dr. Erickson estimated that if Oregon's supply is reallocated, only about 50,000 shots will be available for some 510,000 eligible persons in the state.
