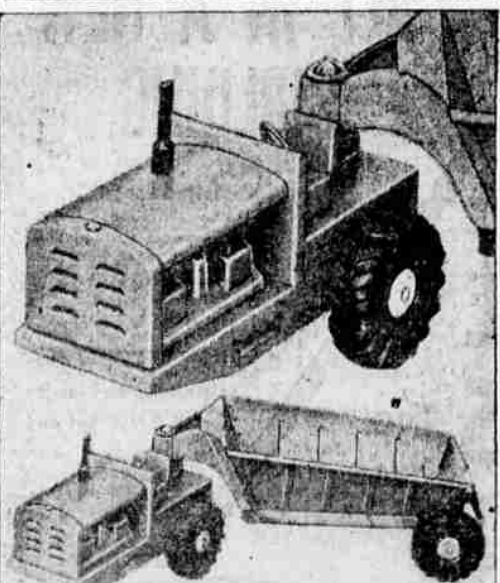

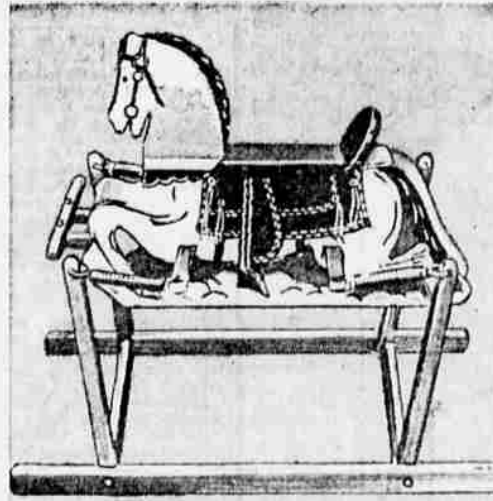

**Let's Approve A New
Sewer System!**

Thorough investigation has led the Douglas County Realty
Board to believe that the sewer bond and plant construction should
be approved in the special December 8 election.

The present city disposal plant is heavily overworked at present
and cannot be expanded. All West Side sewage is now pumped
"uphill" and all further extensions would have to follow the same
expensive procedure. The new plant would be located downriver
for natural gravity flow, with provisions made for future expansion
if necessary.

New construction has virtually stopped because financing has
been cut off on non-sewer property. This decreases employment—
first in building trades, then in independent businesses. As a
result, consumer spending will shrink and community progress will
slacken.

Without a modern sewer system, every property valuation in
town will tend to drop. Present home owners will find it difficult
to sell if necessary and buyers will be blocked from purchase.

Owners who are presently on sewer would benefit by immediate
adoption of the plan because it will be only a question of time
before the present plant must be replaced. Costs in the future are
bound to be higher than at present. New lateral extensions will
be paid for by the new areas benefitting from them and not by
those who are now on sewer.

Let's show our foresight and civic pride by going ahead with
this worthwhile program before the State Sanitary Authority finds
it necessary to exert pressure on us!
