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Eastern Air Lines Will Buy 26 Jet Airplanes

NEW YORK 8P — Eastern Air Lines announced Wednesday it will buy 26 of the 550-mile-an-hour DC8 jet airplanes at a cost of 163 million dollars. Production will start immediately on 18 of them. Eight are on option.

The Eastern purchase will bring to 95 the number of DC8s ordered by airlines. Total cost will be 500 million dollars. Boeing Airplane Co. has received orders for 55 of its 707 jet airliner involving 274 million dollars.
