Hagerty Hits Back At Gov. Harriman, Cites Tammany

GETTYSBURG, Pa. (AP)—James C. Hagerty, White House Press Secretary, described New York Gov. Averell Harriman Wednesday as the first man in history to be "nominated" for the presidency by Tammany Hall.

Hagerty spoke out at a news conference when asked if he had any comment on Harriman's blast at administration foreign policy in an address to the combined AFL and CIO in New York Tuesday.

The press secretary—making it plain he was speaking for himself and not for the President—replied, "For a man who isn't a candidate it seems to me very surprising that he (Harriman) allows himself to be put in a candidate's position by the leader of Tammany Hall."

"That is the first time I've heard—as far as I've known in the history of our country—of letting Tammany Hall nominate someone as a candidate for President."

Harriman has expressed willingness to accept the Democratic presidential nomination next year. Tammany leader Carmine DeSapio said in Washington recently that Harriman will be more than a "token" candidate. Hagerty said it was DeSapio's Washington statement that he was referring.

Republican National Chairman Leonard W. Hall similarly singled out Harriman rather than Adlai E. Stevenson or other top Democratic presidential possibilities for criticism after he conferred with Eisenhower here last week.

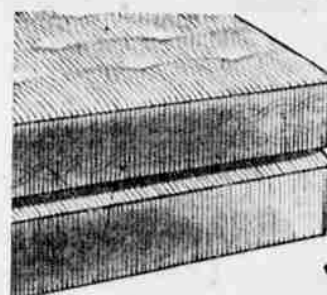

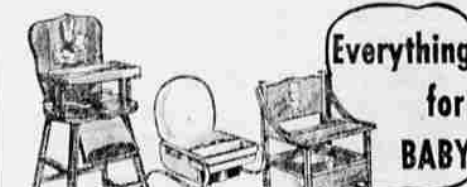
