Indian Congress Against Guardianship Withdrawal

SALT LAKE CITY UP—The Executive Council of the National Congress of American Indians here has gone on record as opposed to legislation which will withdraw the Indians from federal guardianship.

Joseph H. Garry, Council head from Plummer, Idaho, said, "We are opposed to the plan specified in legislation passed by the 83rd Congress because it liquidates Indians' total assets."

The Council also discussed plans for the annual convention of their group here next September and what it will present to a meeting of tribal lawyers and church representatives meeting in Washington D.C., in February.

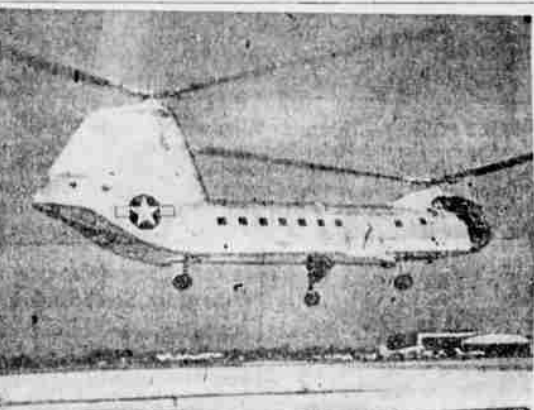
