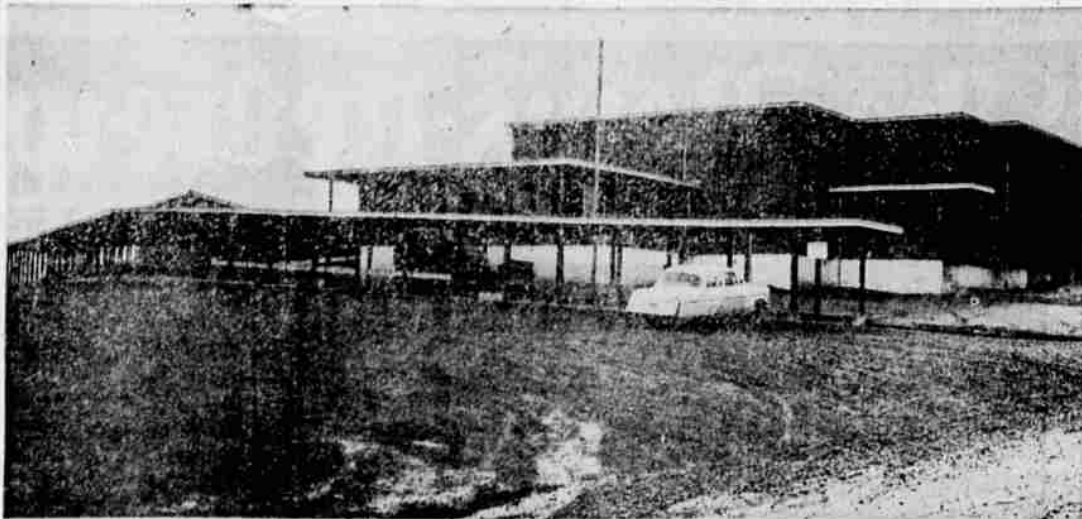
Mrs. Nettie Peery is reported to be seriously ill at her home. She is being cared for by her daughter Mrs. Flora Groff.

BUILT FOR SUTHERLIN—Architectural Record, a trade magazine published in Berkeley, Calif., has some glowing words about the new Sutherlin Elementary School just completed. In its November issue, it reports the building was designed to the character of the town, a rustic one. It points out simple and economical construction was achieved through plywood interior walls, cedar board and battens for exterior siding, concrete floor slab and acous-

tical tile ceilings. The building cost \$185,590, about \$10.43 per square foot. Included in the cost is a sewage disposal system, excavation and drainage work and a well connection. Classroom wings, each containing four classrooms, are placed at an angle so as to follow contours of the hill. It now has two wings, and two more are contemplated. Pravda Hails Success Of Party Chiefs' Tour

MOSCOW (AP) — The Communist party newspaper Pravda hailed the success of the tour of India and Burma by Soviet Premier Bulganin and the party chief, Nikita Khrushchev, saying it has filled the Western powers with anger and confusion.

Izvestia, the government newspaper, and Red Star, the Soviet army paper, also cheered strengthening of relations between the Soviet Union and India and Burma. All assailed the Western powers as colonialists and imperialists and denounced the U.S. and British press for efforts to "pervert facts and deceive public opinion." The articles and editorials in Moscow newspapers would give readers who do not otherwise the

impression that India and Burma are firm Soviet allies instead of being committed to neutralist policies.
