

Assistant Attorney General Says Requiring Statements From All Volunteers Joke

WASHINGTON (AP)—Asst. Atty. Gen. Stanley N. Barnes said here today that any blanket order for all unpaid volunteer federal workers to file statements of their financial interests would be a "complete joke."

In testimony before a House Judiciary subcommittee, Barnes noted the government uses the services of nearly 100,000 unpaid volunteer workers. He said all but a handful consists of such people as Gray Ladies, Red Cross helpers, draft board members, agriculture extension workers, deputy game wardens and wives of forest rangers.

To require these individuals to file financial statements, he said, "would make a complete joke of any financial filing requirements."

The House subcommittee is studying an order President Eisenhower issued last month governing activities of "dollar-a-year" men in government. These officials must file statements of financial interests.

Chairman Celler (D-NY) said in advance of Barnes' testimony he felt there should be wider application of Eisenhower's order.

The order applies only to "WOCs"—without compensation officials—employed under the Defense Production Act. There are about 350 businessmen WOCs and consultants who administer scarce materials priorities, defense tax benefits and other provisions of the DPA.

Barnes stressed that only DPA WOCs enjoy a measure of exemption from laws prohibiting federal employes from retaining private business interests which could

conflict with their official duties. The conclusion seems warranted that any excursion by executive order into non-DPA WOC and non-DPA expert and consultant areas should await some indication of congressional direction," Barnes said.

Before the hearing, Celler said Eisenhower's order had been blown up out of all proportions as to its significance.

He told newsmen it added nothing new to existing law, and was "only a re-statement" of restrictions added by Congress to the Defense Production Act last August.

Celler called it "regrettable" the presidential order did not extend to businessmen-officials throughout all the government.

Spring, Summer Salmon Runs High This Year

PORTLAND (AP)—Spring and summer runs of salmon in the Columbia River mounted this year to the highest levels since 1938, but fall runs continued to decrease, Army Engineers reported Saturday.

Ivan Donaldson, the Engineers' fish biologist at Bonneville Dam, where the fish are counted as they climb the bypass ladders, said the trend has been for spring and summer runs of chinook, steelhead and blueback salmon to increase, while fall runs drop off.

The spring chinook runs, for the months of March, April and May, was a record 121,596. The previous high since construction of Bonneville Dam in 1938, was 170,287 in 1952.

The summer chinook run was a record 95,100. The previous high was 90,399 in 1952.

The spring steelhead run was 4,353, the summer run 157,359 and the fall run 36,797. Donaldson said the summer run, while good, was exceeded by the 186,000 of 1952.

The blueback run was a record 237,748. The previous high was 235,215 in 1953.

All told, the third largest number of salmon went up the fish ladders this year, a total of 800,064, exceeded only by 875,796 in 1952 and 806,264 in 1953.

Adding in other salmon, squawfish, trout, shad and other fish the total number of fish going past the dam was 1,955,987, the seventh largest in 18 years of counting. The record was 1,206,836 in 1947.

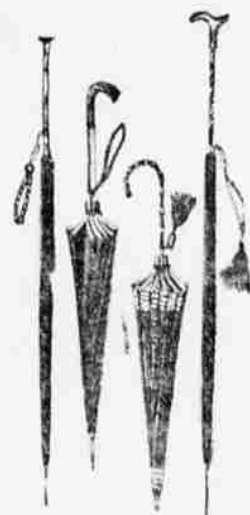
