Union President's Car Damaged By Explosion

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — An explosion Monday badly damaged the parked car of Charles Clark, president of Local 746, International Union of Electrical Workers. No one was injured. The union struck the Westinghouse plant here Oct. 17.

The car bombing was the latest development in the strike situation here, intensified by a back-to-work movement which started last Monday. This move spread to Westinghouse plants in Mansfield and Lima, Ohio.

In Baltimore, ten pickets, including the local union president, a member of the international negotiating committee and an international representative, were arrested Monday outside a strikebound Westinghouse Electric Corp. plant.

Police charged them with disorderly conduct. They said the pickets weren't keeping far enough apart. At Edison, N.J., Louis Zimmer, president of the IEU local, and another picket were arrested outside the Westinghouse plant Sunday night on disorderly persons charges. Police said Zimmer, 28, and Lawrence McDeed, 28, became abusive when a train started to discharge fuel oil at the strikebound plant.
