

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—Nikita Khrushchev Monday told Indian peasants in a model village being improved with U.S. help that they are victims of "exploitation and discrimination."

The excited crowds at Sonapat, 40 miles north of New Delhi, hailed the Soviet Communist Party boss and Premier Bulganin with shouts of "long live the Russian emperors" as they walked for nearly a mile along lines carpeted with rose petals.

The village is the showplace of India's community development program, a joint Indian-U.S. technical cooperation plan.

Khrushchev told the applauding crowd, who listened to a translation in Hindi, that "peasants everywhere have been deprived of education and other facilities of life." But the peasants in Russia,

he asserted, "have political power and have built themselves materially and spiritually to the greatest extent possible."

The Red party chief recommended "the collectivization of agriculture and its speedy mechanization so that you may have more leisure for studies and other enjoyments."

Budget Balance Before Tax Cut Said Ike's Wish

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republican leaders said Monday President Eisenhower is likely to propose that Congress wait until the budget is actually balanced before moving to cut taxes.

They added he might outline his position in his State of the Union message to Congress.

Eisenhower reviewed his 1956 program with GOP leaders of the Senate and House at a three-hour White House session Monday morning.

Afterward James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, said administration leaders were hopeful that with an increasing economy and no loss in existing revenue the goal of balancing the budget could be reached next June without any cut in national defense programs.

Sen. George (D-Ga.), a veteran member of the tax handling Senate Finance Committee, predicted over the weekend that the Demo-

cratic-controlled House Ways and Means Committee would begin consideration of tax cuts quickly after Congress convenes in January.

Top Subjects Covered

Hagerty listed several subjects covered at Monday morning's conference. They included proposed social security expansion, increased health coverage, grants for medical research, plans for school construction and a nationwide wa-

ter resources proposal.

Congressional leaders forecast that the President would urge a highway program in his message, but leave it up to Congress to find an acceptable way to finance it.

The congressional leaders agreed generally that Eisenhower looked physically well and that he participated vigorously in the conference.






