PORTLAND — Elimination of hunger through collection and distribution of scientific knowledge is the goal of the United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization, the annual Agricultural Cooperative Council of Oregon meeting was told this week.

The U. N. group's consultant, Raymond W. Miller of Harvard University, said, "Never before in all human history has there been any comparable effort to help men help themselves to a full plate of food. FAO believes that in its objective of balancing food and people lie at least one of the keys to a peaceful world."

The council was to close its meeting Wednesday with election of officers.

C. C. Dysinger, Dillard School principal, has entered the Community Hospital for surgery.

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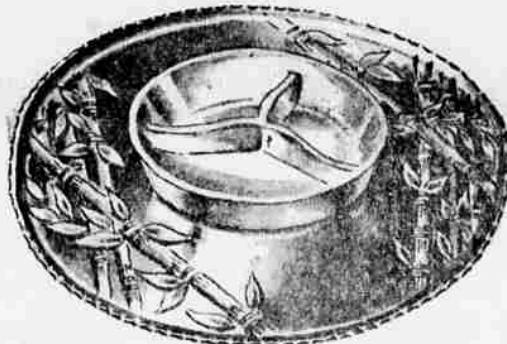
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
