declared tentative winner of the contest when his name was drawn Nov. 28 in a pool of film favorites. But Denver theaters which sponsored the affair refused to give Sacks the prizes, claiming he violated contest rules by depositing entry coupons in bunches. The dispute was submitted to arbitration after Sacks threatened court action.

The arbitrators decided unanimously there was no provision in the contest rules for disqualification of any contestant because one or more of his entries was illegal. Even though Sacks deposited more than 1,000 coupons, the board found that his winning ticket was legally cast.

Extracting Wax From Bark Given Extensive Study

EUGENE — Plans for constructing a multi-million dollar Oregon plant for extracting wax from Douglas fir bark are under study by the M. W. Kellogg Co. of Jersey City, N. J.

W. O. Teeters, associate director of research for the company, said Monday in a telephone conversation that the researchers will make a recommendation Wednesday on whether the company should go ahead with the process.

Then, he said, the company's officials may take several weeks to reach a final decision. Gustina Bros. Lumber Co. of Eugene provided the firm with several carloads of fir bark while it conducted experiments with the wax extraction process developed by the Oregon Forest Products Laboratory at Corvallis.

Teeters said the Kellogg firm has not made a definite decision as to where the plant will be built (Chamber of Commerce leaders are hopeful that it will be here). The Oregon Development Commission in a monthly newsletter said the company has "successfully completed all preliminary fact-finding steps, concluding with a six-month market survey."

The commission said a plant employing up to 200 persons may be built in Oregon. It estimated the potential value of products from waste fir bark in Oregon and Washington at more than 200 million dollars per year.

Washington State Agrees To Share Toll Bridge Cost OLYMPIA, Wash. — The Washington Toll Bridge Authority agreed formally Tuesday to share with Oregon 50 per cent of the cost of rebuilding the Interstate Bridge linking Portland and Vancouver. The federal government would foot the other half of the bill. State Highways Director W. A. Ruge, said the Oregon Highway Commission would act on a similar resolution late Tuesday or on Wednesday. The resolutions are procedural steps necessary before the federal government will give final approval to pay the other half of the estimated three million dollar reconstruction cost. The two states' share of the cost will come from a 14 million dollar bond issue authorized to finance construction of a new bridge across the Columbia River between Vancouver and Portland and to rebuild the existing span. Work on the old bridge will begin after completion of the new one, Ruge said. It will be raised to the height of the new one, giving the same clearance for navigation. The Oregon Highway Commission recently announced it would call for bids on the new bridge in mid-January. Attorneys Ask For New Trial For Sherry Fong

PORTLAND — The attorney of Sherry Fong filed a motion Tuesday asking a new trial. The attorney, Irvin Goodman, asked that the second degree murder verdict against Mrs. Fong for the death of Diane Hank, be set aside.

A 22-page motion filed with Circuit Judge Alfred P. Dolson says Mrs. Fong failed to get a fair and impartial trial. It says evidence was not sufficient for the verdict. "If the motion were granted it would give Mrs. Fong her fourth trial. In the first she was convicted but Judge Dolson set the verdict aside; in the second a mistrial was declared early; and in the third she was convicted on a 10-2 vote of killing 16-year-old Diane Hank, her occasional baby sitter and friend.
