OSC, Ducks Win From Midwest 5's

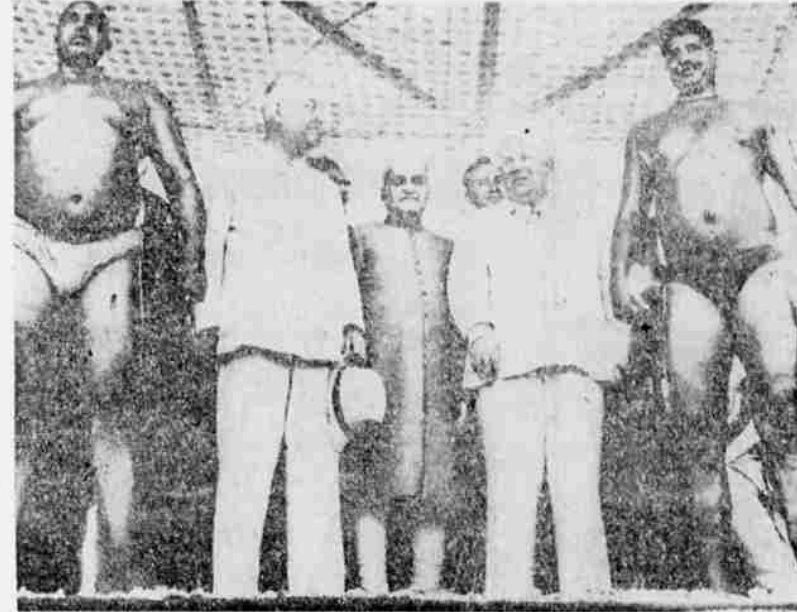

Pacific Northwest College basketball teams dished out lumps—and took a few—in Tuesday night competition at home and abroad.
Oregon and Oregon State disposed of Northwestern and Michigan of the Big Ten in a pre-Christmas tourney at Corvallis, but Washington, continuing a so far unsuccessful tour of the East, bowed to the St. Louis Billikens.
Among independents, Seattle University made it two straight over St. Mary's of California, but Gonzaga lost to Montana University.
The Wednesday night schedule sends Oregon and Oregon State against the Big Ten visitors in a doubleheader at Eugene, Oregon, 85-81 victor over Northwestern Tuesday night will play Michigan, while Oregon State's Beavers, who beat the Wolverines, 84-71 Tuesday night, will take on Northwestern.
Washington took to the road after its 85-77 loss Tuesday night to St. Louis, heading for Columbus and an engagement Thursday night with Ohio State.
Idaho returns to action Wednesday night, visiting Washington University at St. Louis.
The Michigan-Oregon State clash at Corvallis Tuesday night was anybody's game in the first half. The score was tied 14 times before reserve forward Wayne Moss sank two free throws to put the Staters ahead to stay. OSC led 30-25 at the half. Michigan guard Ken Nanson topped the scorers with 22 points. Dave Gamboe was high for OSC with 19.
Oregon found the range in the last five minutes to put the stopper on Northwestern. The visitors led most of the first half and were in front, 32-44 at halftime. The Ducks caught up when the second half was three minutes old and finally passed Northwestern for keeps with seven minutes to go. Oregon center Max Anderson pumped in 31 points for the Ducks. Dick Mast had 27 and Glen Lose 29 points for Northwestern.
At St. Louis, sophomore center Bruno Boin scored 23 points for Washington and paced a late-game rally that fell just short of catching the Billikens. The Huskies trailed by 22 points, 56-34, when they started their drive midway of the second half. They cut the margin to 66-63 before St. Louis again found the range. The Hills led, 68-62 at the half.
Seattle U's 6-9 Bob Godes pumped in a field goal in the opening minute at Seattle and the game was all but over for St. Mary's. The Chieftains led 46-39 at halftime and coasted to an 84-69 final victory. Seattle's Dick Stricklin took scoring honors with 19 points.
At Missoula, Montana U. and Gonzaga swapped basket for basket in the first half which ended with Montana in front, 43-42. The Grizzlies began pulling away four minutes into the second half and rolled on to an 85-69 triumph. Zip Rhoades bucketed 23 points for Montana and Harry Watson had 29 for Gonzaga.

Ex-Coach For Illinois In Serious Condition

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) — Bob Zupke, one of America's foremost football coaches, is hospitalized and in serious condition after suffering a stroke last weekend.
Zupke, 76, Illinois coach for 29 seasons before retiring in 1941, was hospitalized last Friday with what physicians called a "cerebral vascular accident."
Dr. J. B. Christie, associated with Cole Hospital, said "You'd call it a hemorrhage or blood clot."
Zupke, who led Illinois to seven football titles and was the master of the upset, reportedly suffered paralysis of the right arm and had lost his power of speech. However, Zupke was uttering words Tuesday.

Dayton Edges No. 3 Utah; Dons Push Past Wichita

It appeared today as if the University of Utah walked into the same kind of a trap as a year ago, when the highly rated Utes found the University of Kentucky field-house one of their biggest jinxes.
While San Francisco retained its No. 1 status last night by downing Wichita 75-65 at Wichita, Kan., Utah saw its No. 3 ranking slightly tarnished when Dayton won a 77-73 decision in the opener of the Kentucky Invitational Tournament at Lexington.
Jim Paxson, a 6-foot-6 Dayton mainstay, was the big man around the basket for the nation's fourth-ranked college club as he contributed 35 points to the cause. It was Utah's first defeat in six games, and ran Dayton's string to 7-0. Paxson's total was a record for the Kentucky tourney. Gary Bergen led Utah with 24 points.
Last December in the same tournament, Kentucky knocked off Utah in the first round, and the Utes then dropped a consolation third place game to Southern California. Utah suffered only two more losses all season.
In the other game at Lexington, Kentucky downed Minnesota 72-65 as Bob Burrow collected 27 points. Dayton won by a slight favorite over Kentucky in tonight's title game. Kentucky, ranked ninth nationally, appears to be recovering after a bad start this year.
The San Francisco Dons racked up their 32nd straight, 6 this year, by turning back Wichita as 8-foot-10 All-America Bill Russell tapped in 17 points. Bob Hodson, who fouled out for Wichita, also got 17. San Francisco, winner over Marquette and DePaul at Chicago last week, now heads southward to New Orleans to meet Loyola (La.) Friday, before tackling LaSalle in the Holiday Festival starting at Madison Square Garden next Monday.
Loyola spoiled another unbeaten record last night, defeating Bradley 71-65 at New Orleans. Loyola converted 21 of 26 free throws, 11 of 12 by Bobby O'Donnell, who wound up with 31 points.
The best charity shooting of the evening came, however, in the Carrousel Tournament at Charlotte, N. C., where Wake Forest sank 43 of 55 in a foul-riddled game to defeat Colgate 87-80. Jackie Murdoch got 21 points, including 17 of 20 fouls. John Nichols had 22 for Colgate.
Clemson's underdog Tigers upset Tennessee 89-85 in the other semifinal and meets Wake Forest tonight for the championship. Her-

man Thompson bagged 24 points for the losers, while Vince Yockel had 22 and Gene Seay 21 for Clemson.
Other ranking teams came through without too much trouble in other games. Temple, which knocked off Kentucky and is ranked 12th, continued unbeaten by thumping Pennsylvania 93-72. Guy Rodgers had 22 points and Hal Lear 21 for the winners.
Duke, No. 14, wallpopped Pittsburgh 92-54, to run the Blue Devil string to 6-0. Five Duke players scored in double figures, Joe Belmont getting 17. Oklahoma City University, No. 15 this week, pulled away in the last half to sink Auburn 76-58.
St. Louis choked off a second-half rally by the University of Washington and won 85-77. Mack Carter sank a layup with 38 seconds left to give Oklahoma A&M a 67-66 thriller over Oklahoma and Tulsa defeated Baylor 64-59. Purdue defeated Butler 67-59 as Lamar Lundy, a football end, starred with 24 points.
West Virginia scored its third Southern Conference victory by beating Richmond 89-74. "Hot Rod" Humbley scored 21 points for the Mountaineers.
In another tournament at Quantico, Va., Mt. St. Mary's Md. beat Wake Forest 75-75. Ball State won over the Georgia Teachers 83-87. Akron Ohio downed Iona N.Y. 67-54, and the Quantico Marines overpowered LeMoyne N.Y. 109-86. In the championship bracket, Quantico meets Akron and Mt. St. Mary's plays Ball State today.

Negro Hoopster Arouses Crowd By His Conduct

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Forward Shellie McMillon, Bradley's Negro basketball ace, created an uncertain atmosphere for Loyola's integrated athletic program last night when he became the central figure in the school's first racial incident.
McMillon, a 19-year-old sophomore from Chicago, aroused the crowd last night when he fouled out and saluted fans by sticking out his tongue.
The cheers which greeted him during pregame introductions turned into jeers and the Loyola band snapped into "Dixie," marching song of the Confederate Army. A number of fans serenaded McMillon with "Bye, Bye Blackbird" as he left the court.
McMillon's fouling tactics, termed "unnecessary" by sports writer Buddy Diliberto of the Times-Picayune, started a Loyola stampede to the free throw line. Loyola, behind 15 points when the fouling began, hit on 21 of 26 free throws to take a 71-65 victory and hand Bradley its first loss.
Loyola Coach Jim McCafferty later minimized the incident. He said he thought McMillon "lost his head" and became "disgusted" with himself.
"Most of the fouls took place at the far end of the court, and we couldn't see them from our bench," McCafferty said. The Loyola coach said he thought the incident would have little effect on future games with teams that have Negro players.
The University of San Francisco, top-ranked team in the nation,

Negro player, guard Curley Johnson, was a gentleman during the game, but was soundly booed when he left the game because of McMillon's behavior.
The racial issue came up several weeks ago when Georgia Gov. Marvin Griffin asked that Georgia Tech be prohibited from playing Pittsburg in the Sugar Bowl football game here Jan. 2 because of a Negro player on the Pittsburg roster. The Georgia Board of Regents approved Tech's meeting Pitt in the game.
SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Phil Woolpert, coach of the top-ranked University of San Francisco Dons, says he would "pull the team off the floor if an incident occurs" Friday night in the USF basketball game with Loyola of the South at New Orleans.
In a telephone conversation with the San Francisco Chronicle, Woolpert said he was concerned following an incident involving a Negro player Tuesday night in Loyola's 71-65 victory over Bradley.
The player, Bradley's Negro ace, Shellie McMillon, aroused the crowd when he stuck out his tongue after fouling out.
"Three of USF's first stringers are Negroes, including All-America center Bill Russell," Woolpert said.
"I don't know exactly what happened down there. Maybe it was actually a small thing. But I'm going to find out. And when I do, I'll put the decision up to the players. If they vote not to play, that's it."
Woolpert said that even if the Dons did vote to play he "would pull the team off the floor if an incident occurs."
The Dons beat the University of Wichita (Kan.) at Wichita, 75-64, Tuesday night.
