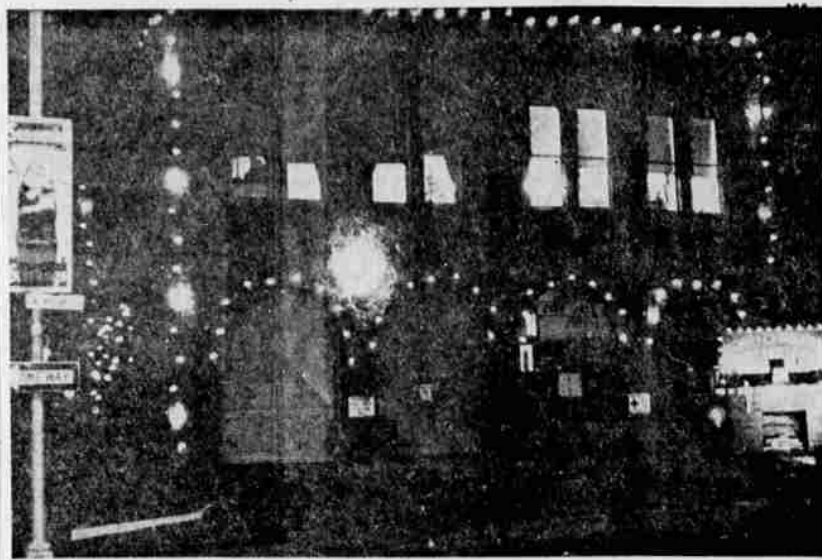

Mrs. Peddicord Asks Entrance To State Hospital

PORTLAND (AP) — Mrs. William Peddicord asked Wednesday to be committed to the state hospital.

The tragedy of the arrest of her husband and her sister in the Meier & Frank Co. store bombing was too much for her to bear, said Dr. N. M. Janzer, director of the city's mental health division.

The request was made public by Det. Capt. William D. Browne who said it was mental depression, not mental illness in the usual sense, which caused the request.

Browne said she had been in for questioning Monday and chose not to leave afterward. Instead, Browne said, she confessed that she had part in the extortion plot which her husband, a blind salesman and part-time chemist, confessed earlier.

But, said Browne, it was apparent she had no part in the affair.

Dr. Janzer said she was "overwrought with fear, burdened with problems."

Her attorney said arrangements had been made for care of her five children.

British Tanks En Route To Bolster Egypt's Army

ANTWERP, Belgium (AP) — An Egyptian freighter sailed Thursday with 15 reconconditioned British Valentine tanks for delivery to the Egyptian army.

An Antwerp newspaper said the Belgian Economic Ministry granted export licenses for tanks and other arms to both Egypt and Israel on a 50-50 basis. It could not be learned, however, whether a tank shipment has been made yet to Israel.

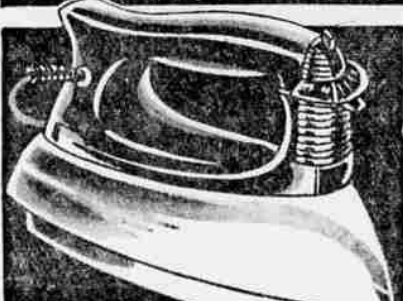
