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Two Roseburg Archers Pace State Meet

Up-state teams lead most divisions of the second annual Oregon Indoor Archery League postal shoot after one round, according to results released this week. Two Roseburg Archers have taken individual leads, however.

Elaine Foster of the league-sponsoring Roseburg Archers leads women individually with a 664 total score for the second place local team. Daro Handy of the first-place Roseburg Juniors leads juniors with a score of 662.

Leading teams besides the Roseburg Juniors are the Kokeel Archers in men's free style with a 2,804 score, the Salem Redwings in men's instinctive with 2,562 and the Portland Sylvans in the women's division with 2,357.

The Roseburg Juniors lead on the basis of a 2,232 score. Other

scoring in addition to Handy's includes 544 by Charles Norris, 526 by Jim Wells and 500 by Tommy Clapp. The Salem Redwing Juniors are second with 1,448.

Leading the men's free style teams are the Kokeel Archers with a 2,804. Dick Hamblen of the second-place Eugene team leads men's scoring in free style with 734. Ohio Stater Average 37.2

NEW YORK (AP)—Robin Freeman, a 5-11 sharpshooter for Ohio State, gained considerable ground over Darrell Floyd of Furman in two games last week as the two paced the nation's major college basketball scoring leaders.

In games through Dec. 17, the NCAA Service Bureau reported that Freeman outscored Floyd by 25 points. Both played in two games.

Freeman averaged 37.2 points, with 186 points in five games, while Floyd's average was 31.4 on 137 points in five contests. Freeman's biggest output was 40 points against Oklahoma, the third time he had scored 40 or more in a game.

George Washington's Joe Petevich, successful on 22 of 30 field goal attempts during the week, replaced Angelo Lombardo of Manhattan as leader in field goal accuracy with 89.6 per cent.

Best free throw mark is 92.6 per cent by Vic Molodet of North Carolina State, who has missed only four in 34 attempts. In team scoring, Morehead State (Ky.) has an average of 99.5 points per game, moving Memphis State as offense leader. Mississippi is second with 98.7, and Memphis State is third with 97.

Dartmouth has supplanted San Francisco in team defense, yielding 48.4 points per game. San Francisco is fourth with 51.7 following Creighton at 49 and Xavier (Ohio) with 51.

Ezzard Charles Bidding For Another Title Shot

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Ezzard Charles, the aging fighter with a yen to come back, takes on young Bob Albright Thursday night, hoping big for another shot at Rocky Marciano and the heavyweight title he once held.

Charles figures to win the scheduled 10-rounder although he probably will be giving away about 25 pounds. Albright is a walk-in swinger, a good target for the more deft Charles.

Albright, of Los Angeles, is the sparring partner who lost his job when he knocked down England's Don Cockell last June while Cockell was getting ready to meet—and lose to—Marciano. He has a record of 23 wins, 2 losses and 2 draws and has never been dropped.

Joe Louis Gets License To Be Married Sunday

NEW YORK (AP)—Former heavyweight boxing champion Joe Louis and Rose Morgan, a beauty shop operator, obtained a marriage license yesterday and plan a Christmas Day wedding.

Louis, 41, although no longer active in the ring, listed his occupation as boxer. His bride-to-be gave her age as 42.

Louis was twice married to Marva Trotter and twice divorced. A previous marriage of Miss Morgan ended in divorce in 1945.

Commented Louis: "I'm very happy. Now I've got somebody to come home to."

Hartack Pushes 412th To Win

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Jockey Willie Hartack, the nation's leading rider, gave his followers some Christmas money at Tropical Park yesterday, then headed upstate to Cypress Gardens and a few days of water skiing.

The flashy 23-year-old saddle-smith brought in four winners on the nine-race program to run his total for the year to 412. His winners were Mr. Blue Sky (\$9.80) in the first, Snare (\$7.20) in the fourth, Yock Tom (\$5.00) in the fifth and Sharp Tack (\$14.10) in the eighth.

Willie finished last on Worthy Option in the ninth and called it quits until Jan. 1.

He had returned to action at Tropical Park Monday after serving a 10-day suspension for allowing his mount to bear out during a race early this month.

Before the suspension began, he rode his 400th winner of the year Dec. 3, ran his score to 404 before the layoff and came back Monday to win two more races. He rode two again Tuesday and clinched it with yesterday's brilliant performance.

He is Tropical's leading rider with 25 winners, 13 seconds and 7 thirds in 71 mounts.

Dayton Snares Invitational Tourney

Dayton's aptly named Flyers had the University of Kentucky Invitational title tucked away in their well-stocked victory bag today and with an apparently clear path ahead they're likely to remain unbeaten for some time.

Dayton made it eight in a row last night by defeating Kentucky, the tourney's host team, 89-74. The fourth-ranked Flyers moved into an 11-point lead early in the game and led the rest of the way.

From now on they have it comparatively easy—for a while anyway. They'll take on fair-to-middle Washington and Lee (2-4) next Wednesday and that'll wind up their year's work. In January, they're booked against Iowa, Canisius, Duquesne, Villanova, Xavier (Ohio) and Louisville.

By that time they could well have moved ahead of San Francisco, North Carolina State and Utah in the national rankings. Utah's position (No. 3) already is something less than secure. The Utes dropped a 90-77 verdict to unranked Minnesota last night in the consolation Kentucky Invitational tilt. The setback came on the heels of another to Dayton Tuesday night.

San Francisco was idle. But second-ranked North Carolina State continued, undefeated by rolling over fifth-ranked Brigham Young 95-81. The Wolfpack pulled to a 45-39 half-time lead and then coasted to their eighth triumph of the season and 20th straight over two years. Ron Shavlik got 28 points and Vic Molodet 25.

Eighth-ranked Vanderbilt rang up its sixth victory without a defeat by trimming Nebraska 66-48 with Al Rochelle netting 22 points.

Louisville, with Charlie Tyra collecting 35 points, pulled one of the surprises of the night, trampling Marquette 84-68. The Warriors, ranked 13th never could get going.

Wake Forest came through as expected to win the Carrousel Classic in Charlotte, N.C., with a runaway 98-79 victory over Clemson.
