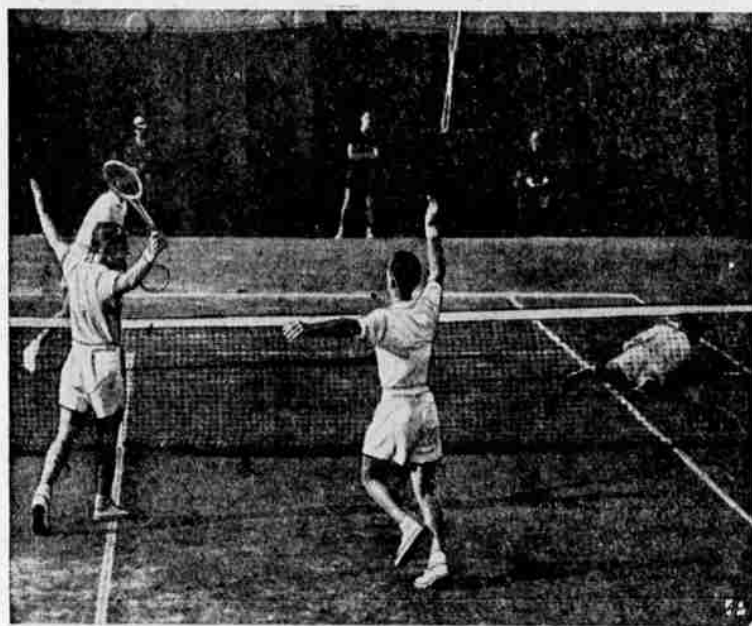


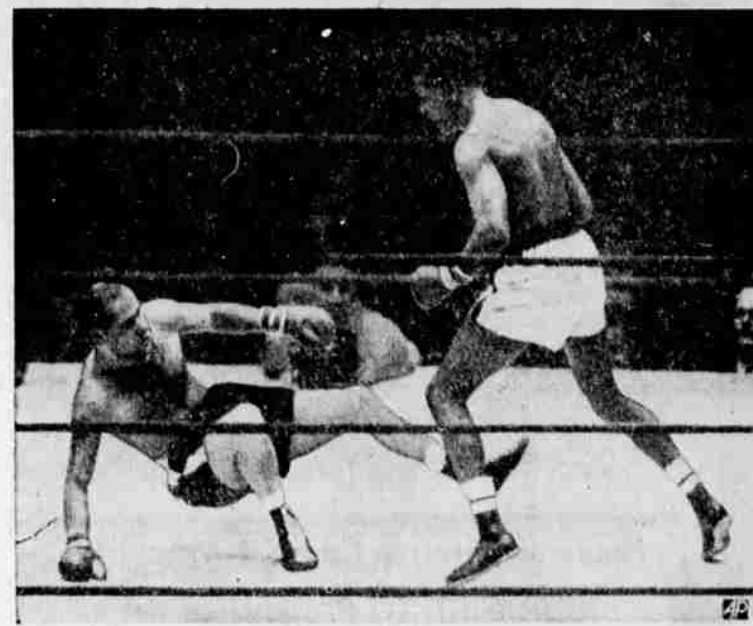
1955: A YEAR OF SPORTS IN PICTURES

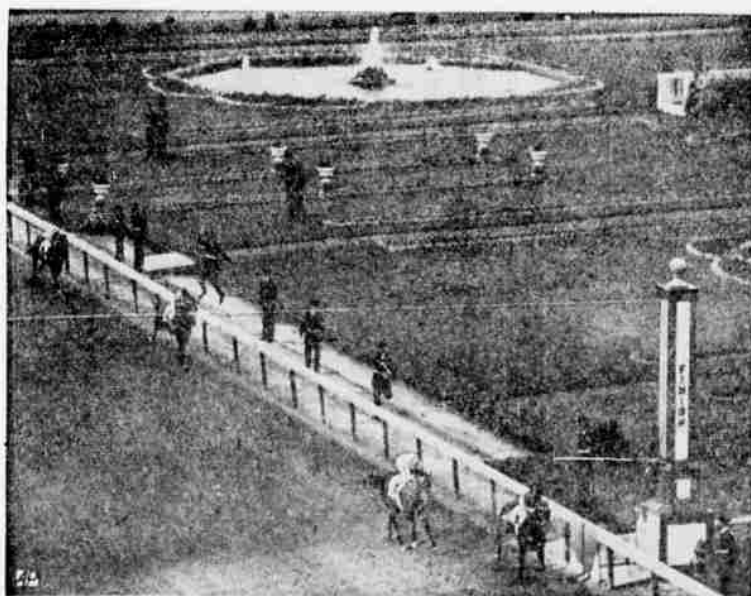
