

Ouster Of Law Schools In Race Bar Is Denied

CHICAGO — A proposal to expel any member school that bars qualified Negro students failed to pass Friday at the annual meeting of the Assn. of American Law Schools.

The showdown came on a resolution brought in by the Committee on Racial Discrimination.

With a two-thirds majority of schools represented necessary for adoption, the tally was: 52 for, 44 against, and 6 abstentions.

The schools—membership is by schools, rather than individuals—then approved a motion that the Executive Committee "take care to further the objectives" of the association in carrying on its duties.

One of the objectives, adopted in 1951, is "equality of opportunity in legal education without discrimination or segregation on the ground of race or color."

The difference between the objective and the resolution which fell short of adoption Friday is that the resolution provided for ouster of member schools.

EX-LEGISLATOR DIES

PORTLAND — Dr. F. H. Damstra, 76, a physician and dentist who served six terms in the state House of Representatives, died in a hospital Thursday night. He had suffered a stroke Dec. 26.

His first legislative term was in 1933, and thereafter he was in the 1935, 1947, 1951, 1953 and 1955 sessions.

Klamath Rancher Cattleman Of Year

PRINEVILLE — Lawrence J. Horton, Klamath Falls, who started with one heifer 41 years ago, Thursday night became Oregon Cattleman of the Year.

He received the Herman Oliver trophy at the annual meeting of the Oregon Cattlemen's Assn. Oliver made the presentation.

Horton traded a boat to an Indian for a heifer of mixed Hereford and Shorthorn blood and rented a farm to get his start in the cattle business. Now he has 1,000 head of registered Hereford cattle on 7,500 acres of deeded land.

From sagebrush, swamp and steep slopes, he has built up 1,500 acres of irrigated pasture. His ranch also has 650 acres of alfalfa and hay land.

Nominations for the award were made in each county with the field then narrowed to four finalists. The other three finalists were Ray Graffenberger, Prineville; John Fisk, Innaha; and Cecil Snyder, Molalla.

Electrical Energy Total For Week 111 Billion

NEW YORK — Electrical energy distributed last week totaled a record 11,614,000,000 kilowatt hours to set a record for the fourth week in a row.

That was 3.1 per cent higher than the 9,431,000,000 kilowatt hours distributed in the same week a year ago.

All sections of the country shared in the upsurge. The Pacific Northwest had the highest rate of increase over last year at 23.9 per cent.

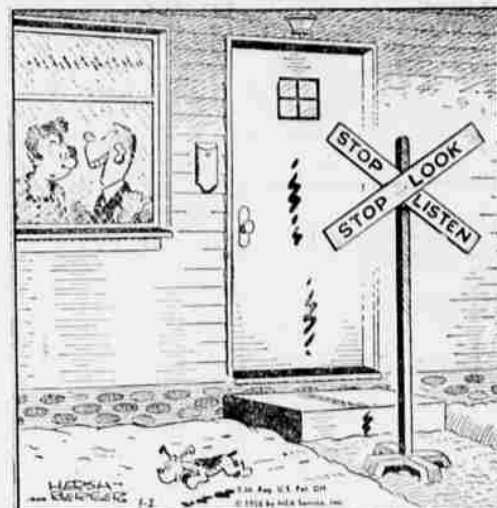
