His two boys walked seven miles to the road and then to a house to call for help. A jeep drove to within two miles of the camp and they walked in. Hollamon was carried out to the jeep and taken to Cottage Grove Hospital.

It was found he had broken his pelvis bone. He will be hospitalized for over a month. No one else was injured.

Skunks sometimes share a burrow with a rabbit or a woodchuck.

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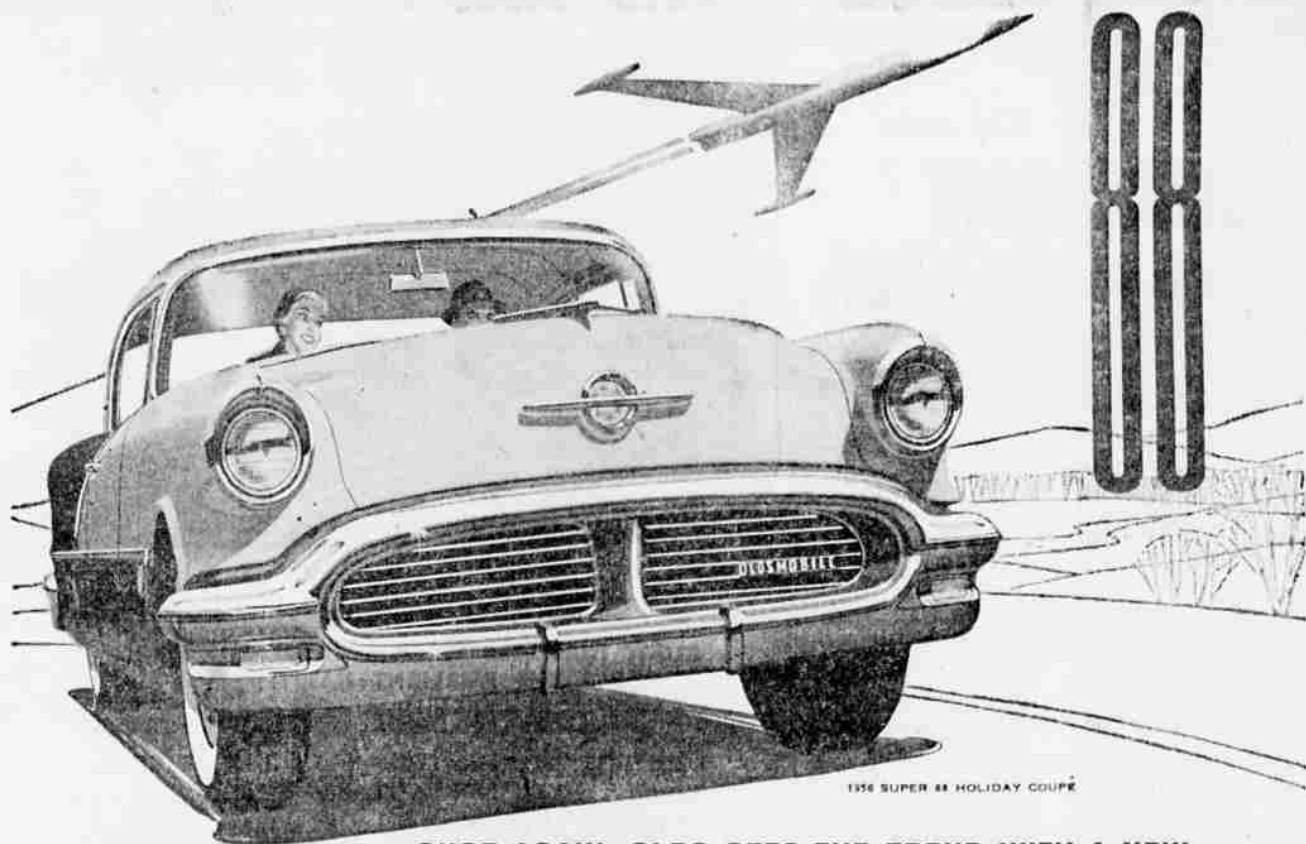
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
