Texas Pleads Guilty To Fraud, Is Sentenced

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — Bascom Giles, former state land commissioner who once cautioned veterans to be careful in buying land under the state's 190-million-dollar GI aid program, pleaded guilty again Tuesday to wrongdoing as administrator of that program.

Waiving his right to trial by jury, Giles listened grimly as Judge Charles O. Betts sentenced him to six years imprisonment in each of nine convictions of being an accomplice to felony theft. Total amount involved in the nine cases was \$38,875.

The sentences were ordered to run concurrently with previous six-year penalties assessed in Bexar and Zavala Counties for agreeing to accept a bribe.
