

Vatican Warns Against Big Communist Smile

VATICAN CITY, (AP)—The Vatican warned Roman Catholics Saturday against a new big smile campaign by the Communists.

The warning was sounded amid an intensive Communist campaign in Italy to influence Catholics. The Communist press has been devoting more space to Vatican news than does the Italian press in general.

L'Unita, official Communist party organ, ran a front page editorial Saturday praising the Pope's Christmas message and assailing the United States.

A communique published Saturday in L'Osservatore Romano, the official newspaper of the Vatican, said the Pope's Christmas message was "a message of peace and brotherly love, which not only forbade Catholics to join the Communist party but warned them they cannot lend support to the party or other periodicals supporting Communist doctrine and action."

Shipping Certifications Increase By 30 Per Cent

Shipping point inspections of fruits and vegetables in Oregon during November totaled 4,687 on a carlot basis—1,309 cars above the same month a year ago.

More than half, or 54 per cent, of the certifications were on potatoes; 13 per cent on onions; 6 per cent on apples and pears; and 27 per cent on other items, largely pears and apples. Not included in these totals are 31 cars of huckleberries which moved out under state grades, reports the Oregon State Department of Agriculture.

Shipments under federal-state grades from July 1 to Dec. 1 reached 15,167 cars. This is 933 cars ahead of last year, according to W. L. Chase, state supervisor of the shipping point inspection service. The four shipping districts with largest November volume were Klamath Falls, Redmond, Ontario and Hood River, in that order.

James Elliot's Parents Find Solace In Their Religion, After Slayings By Indians

PORTLAND, (AP)—The parents of James Elliot found solace in their religion Saturday after learning of the slaying of their missionary son at the hands of the savage Aucas Indians in Ecuador.

"God so loved the world that He gave His own son. Could we do less?" Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Elliot, Portland, asked.

The father took their Bible and read aloud from the 46th psalm. Afterward, he said:

"It's the poor savages I'm sorry for."

The parents showed final letters from their 28-year-old son, who had gone to Ecuador as a missionary in 1952.

Alumni Records Reveal Students Now Working

More than half of the 1,411 graduates in forestry from Oregon State College during the past 50 years are now at work on forestry jobs in Oregon, a school of forestry alumni record reveals.

The report shows 722 graduates in Oregon forest industries and public agencies.

Outside Oregon, graduates can be found in 22 other states. California has attracted the greatest number, 177. The Washington total is 81 and Idaho, 23.

Fourteen are on forestry jobs in Canada and in Alaska, 12 are in Asia, 6 in South America, 4 in Europe, and 3 in Africa. Seventy-eight are in the armed forces, almost all of them graduates within the past three or four years.

Sixty-five graduates have died. The tabulation was made by forestry professors in preparation for observance of "Fifty Years of Forestry at OSC" on March 3. The all-day program will mark the 50th year that degree-granting work in forestry has been offered at OSC. Instruction in forestry dates back to 1882, however.

All but 128 of the 1,411 graduates since 1910 are accounted for in the listings.

ANIMAL DISEASE REPORT

Reportable livestock diseases found in Oregon herds in November numbered 1,563 cases, according to reports practicing veterinarians filed with the Oregon State Department of Agriculture. Mortality for the month was 75 cases, or 4.8 per cent. Twenty-four diseases in 181 herds appear on the department tabulation. Diseases most often reported in the month were hemorrhagic septicemia (shipping fever), erythema in sheep; infectious keratitis in cattle and sheep; and foot rot in cattle.

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One letter told of his party of missionaries leaving the settlement of Aranjuna to attend a meeting. They left behind Mrs. Marylou McCully, wife of one of the five missionaries later slain by the Indians.

"Friday morning on the radio contacted (McCully) and I were standing by for Marylou in Aranjuna. She was there alone with an Indian servant. She sounded scared."

"The Indian who was staying with her had gotten up early and gone out. He almost ran headon into a naked Auca man standing with a lance in his hand not 20 yards from Ed's house. So Ed and Nate (Nathaniel Saint—another of the slain missionaries) flew out there in a hurry, but nothing more was seen of him. Marylou's Indian wanted to kill the Auca on sight, but Marylou took his gun away and cried out a phrase that means 'I like you.' She tried to give him a machete, but he was gone. One lone wet footprint on a board and some matted grass where he took off into the jungle were all she ever saw of him."

"We would like to reach this tribe...these people are killers...They do not have so much as a word for God in their language, let alone a word for Jesus."

Another letter told of efforts to reach the Aucas.

"We have prayed and prepared for this for several months, keeping the whole thing secret. Some time ago Nate on survey flights located two groups of their houses and ever since that time we have dropped gifts and shouted friendly phrases from a loudspeaker in their language. We learned these phrases from a captured Auca woman in Ila.

"Nate has used his drop cord system to land things right at their doorstep and we have received several gifts back from them—pets and food and things."

"Our plans are to go down the river and land on a beach we have surveyed which is not far from their place."

"I don't have to remind you that these are completely naked savages. They have never had any contact with white men and only killing contacts with the friendly Indians. They do not have firearms, but kill with long chonta wood lances."

"I know you will pray. Our orders are 'the gospel to every creature.'"

His mother said, "He was doing his duty to God. Possibly this is part of his plan to bring His word to these unfortunate savages."

Marsh Urges Caution In Aid To Education

PORTLAND, (AP)—Eugene W. Marsh, chairman of the Oregon delegation to the recent White House Conference on Education, thinks caution should be exercised in the matter of federal aid to education.

Marsh, a former president of the Oregon State Senate, said that delegates to the national conference favored by 2-1 federal aid for construction of schools and were about evenly divided on federal aid for operating the schools.

He told the City Club that he personally opposes the principle of federal aid. But the government might have to step in to help in construction in distressed areas, he added.

He said such help should be on a matching basis and should be granted only for a limited period.
